




CODING


Content Options







Goal 4: Stewardship of Money and Resources

Board's Fiscal Stewardship

- Annual clean audits
- No deficits. Ever.
- Board is responsible for the budget we are allocated by the City.
- Ensure the Library aligns with what residents want.

Public Libraries Act R.S.O. 1990, CHAPTER P.44

Estimates

24 (1) A public library board shall submit to the appointing council, annually on or before the date and in the form specified by the council, estimates of all sums required during the year for the purposes of the board.

Approval of estimates

(2) The amount of the board's estimates that is approved or amended and approved by the council shall be adopted by the board and shall be paid to the board out of the money appropriated for it.

Idem

(3) The board shall apply the money paid to it under subsection (2) in accordance with the estimates as approved, subject to subsection (4).


Council may authorize variation

(4) The council may, in its approval of the board's estimates or at any time at the board's request, authorize the board to apply a specified amount or percentage of the money paid to it under subsection (2) otherwise than in accordance with the items of the estimates as approved.

Evidence-Based Library Administration

Accountability Reporting

- Multiple reporting channels of business reports: City, Commission, the provincial government, and Canadian Urban Libraries Council (CULC)
- Analysis of business intelligence data from multiple sources, including customer surveys, demographic data, Integrated Library System reports, integrating this analysis with relevant trend analysis
- Development of Key Performance Indicators
- Outcome Measurement
- Reporting of annual library achievements and performance data for inclusion in various municipal reports






