4. PERTINENT INFORMATION FROM GUEST SPEAKERS

4.1 York Region South York Streetscape Master Plan

Carmen Hui, Program Manager, Streetscape of York Region delivered a presentation on the South Yonge Street Corridor Streetscape Master Plan. She provided an overview of the Streetscape Master Plan which would guide and improve streetscape along Yonge corridor. It was highlighted that the Streetscape Master Plan 2021 is now completed and the update includes active transportation infrastructure, and takes into consideration of new development in the area such as the Yonge Subway extension. The full report can be downloaded on York Region website.

4.2 South York Greenway Feasibility Study

John Kazilis Manager, Transportation Development Planning and Diana Kakamousias, Program Manager, Sustainable Mobility of York Region delivered a presentation on the South York Greenway (SYG) Feasibility Study. John provided an overview of project area and objectives, as well as consultation timeline. It is anticipated the study project will complete by Summer 2022.

Subsequently, Diana discussed in details the preferred and alternative alignments identified within Markham between Yonge Street and York-Durham Line. Committee members are invited to provide feedback on the Miro map at <u>http://york.ca/southyorkgreenway</u> until December 30.

There was a comment that the alignment of the SYG should be separated from the Rouge Valley Trail. Given the number of pedestrian and trail conflicts on the RVT, the proposed alignment through the RVT segment may impose further problems.

5. BUSINESS ARISING FROM LAST MEETING

5.1 ATMP & Suggested CPAC Work Items for 2022

Staff provided an update on the ATMP and that it was approved by Council on November 23. Council has also directed staff to prepare a 10-year capital plan to be presented by March 2022.

David Rawcliffe, Peter Miasek and Steve Glassman prepared a table of suggested CPAC work items for 2022 based on the ATMP recommendations. In addition, a list of existing and new subcommittees was proposed for discussion.

It was suggested that the Road Safety and Pedestrian committees be combined, as well as Micromobility and New technologies & policies committees. Paul Salvo also mentioned that Jane's Walk subcommittee should be added to the list, and that he would not be able to continue when his term on CPAC is due.

Staff will arrange a meeting in January with CPAC Chair/Vice-Chairs to review the proposed list in details.

Reena Mistry from York Region District School Board provided an update on the Active School Travel (AST) program. The AST program was relaunched in Fall 2021 with a number of improvements and programs such as bicycle pop-ups, pavement markings, mobile signs, banners and more. She also discussed the "School Streets" pilot at John McCrae P.S. where the street in front of the school is planned to temporarily closed around bell times. She is working closely with City staff for implementation in May 2022. Also, it was mentioned that the AST program has now expanded to Newmarket at 6 schools. Data will be collected to evaluate against Markham's data in the development of potential standardization across York Region.
