





2022 TRANSPORTATION MASTER PLAN PROJECT SCHEDULE




Draft TMP aligns with ROP, WWMP and DC Bylaw Updates





TRANSPORTATION NETWORK AND FOCUS AREA RECOMMENDATIONS





2051 REGIONAL ROAD CYCLING NETWORK




- Increased interest in cycling along Regional corridors
- Corridors to support all modes
- Separated cycling facilities are preferred
- Includes \$500 million for standalone active transportation projects (Region share: 100%)

2051 REGIONAL TRAIL NETWORK




- Cyclists can also use the trails network
- Partnering with locals and conservation authorities
- Expanded emphasis on trails of regional significance
- Connections beyond the Region's boundaries

2051 RAPID TRANSIT NETWORK



- Consistent with provincial plans
- Protects the Region's long-term interests
- Includes existing and future transit stations which inform land use planning
- Focus on transit infrastructure, not services
- Includes \$12.5 billion for transit projects (Region share: \$4.1 billion)

2051 ROAD NETWORK



- Car continues as primary travel choice for many residents
- Delivery of road network relies on partnerships
- Project details determined through environmental assessments
- Includes \$6.8 billion for road projects (Region share: \$4.4 billion)

2022 TMP FOCUS AREAS

- 1. Safety for all travellers
- 2. Transportation equity providing transportation options inclusive of all ages, abilities, income levels, etc.
- 3. Reduce car travel especially during rush hours
- 4. Fiscal and environmental sustainability
- 5. Review role and function of **Regional** corridors

- 3. Plan for Donald Cousens Parkway connection to Highway 48


