7. DIRECTOR'S REPORT

C. Molloy gave a report. "Pottery classes and programs are extremely popular and most classes are full with waiting lists. Andrea is working on developing new program content for schools and general programming and, as are most facilities, is struggling with finding staff. She is also training staff for blacksmithing and hoping to develop blacksmithing classes, as we offer for the pottery.

Janet is making progress on collection care and documentation. Markham Moves will be in place until January 2024, and Conservation Crusaders will be the next exhibit. As the Friends are aware, the gallery space is large and quality exhibits take time and money. Program staff are good with this extension as there is well-developed program for the exhibit. There is still positive feedback from visitors, who continue to return specifically to visit Markham Moves.

Scaryfest had close to 3,500 attendees. The City Central Counties Grant made extra promotion and activity possible; however, attendance greatly exceeded staff expectation. Rental staff, due to staffing levels, did not negotiate any rentals for fall 2022. Cynthia is planning to reopen booking for dates starting in April 2023.

Repairs and replacement work for both Cider Mill and Train Station will start early in 2023. This work halted during COVID by City administration.

The Economic Growth, Culture and Entrepreneurship Department is developing a strategic plan. The Friends are stakeholders; you will be contacted for input, if you have not already been contacted.

I attended the Ontario Museum Association annual conference in Hamilton this week, Jane Reid attended also. The session material was very good.

Applications have closed for the Museum Director position. Interviews will be next week; it is the hope that there is some over-lap before I retire."
