

## **Attachment B - Summary of Sewer Use By-law Updates**

1. In Part 1 “Definitions and Interpretation”, added 21 new definitions and updated 5 definitions.
  - To explain various types of interceptor & their application – Grease Interceptor, Oil interceptor, Grit Interceptor and Sediment Interceptor.
  - To define those business sectors required to install the specific Interceptors – Food Business Sector Establishment, Vehicle Equipment Service Operation as well as Vehicle Wash Operation.
2. In Part 14 “Grease Interceptors for Food Sector Establishment”, to detail the requirements of Grease Interceptor Installation & Maintenance”:
  - Grease interceptor installation
  - Fixture connections
  - Grease interceptor sizing
  - Grease interceptor maintenance
  - Grease interceptor maintenance records and submission to the City.
3. To divide the previous Part 15 “Vehicle and Equipment Service Oil and Grease Interceptors” into two Parts:
  - Part 15 “Oil Interceptors for Vehicle and Equipment Operation”
  - Part 16 “Grit Interceptor for Vehicle Wash Operation”

In both Part 15 & Part 16, the Interceptor maintenance and related records keeping are explained.
4. Clarify Part 17 “Sediment Interceptor for Storm Sewer”, which is only for those Sediment Interceptors connected to the storm system.
5. In Part 20 “Municipal Sewer Connections”, explain Section 20.8 “Installation of Municipal Sewer Connection” through three sub-sections:
  - Municipal Sewer Connection - Installation by the City
  - Municipal Sewer Connection - Installation by the owner
  - All Private Sewers and their Connection to Municipal Sewer Connection - Installation by the owner
6. In Part 20 “Municipal Sewer Connections”, add new Section 20.14 “Maintenance of Municipal Sewer Connection and Private Sewers” and layout the related aspects:
  - Maintenance of Municipal Sewer Connections
  - Blockages in Private Sewers

- Blockages caused by the Oil & Grease, food waste or other solids
  - Blockages caused by Structural Defects or Damages
  - Blockages caused by the Tree Roots
7. In Part 20 “Municipal Sewer Connections”, add new Section 20. 15 “Private Residential Swimming Pools or Hot tubs/Spas or Wading pools” to help residents understand how to properly discharge the water from their private swimming pools.
  8. Add new Part 23 “Order to Comply” to the By-law. It explains the “Order to Comply” bylaw enforcement approach.
  9. Add new Part 27 “Administrative Penalties” to the By-law. It explains the “Administrative Monetary Penalty System (AMPS)” bylaw enforcement approach.
