7. REGULAR REPORTS - ENVIRONMENT & SUSTAINABILITY MATTERS

7.1 BUILDING MARKHAM'S FUTURE TOGETHER WORKSHOP #3

7.1.1 PRESENTATION 1: BUILDING MORE HOUSING

Andy Taylor, Chief Administrative Officer, addressed the Committee and attendees to provide opening remarks. He noted that today's Building Markham's Future Together session is focused on housing and that while the City signed a housing pledge to create 44,000 new homes, it will take all levels of government to work together to achieve this goal.

Mr. Taylor introduced, Dr. Michael Moffat, Senior Director, Policy and Innovation, Smart Prosperity Institute, Assistant Professor, Economics ad Public Policy, Ivey Business School, Western University whose research focusses on the intersection of regional economic development, building child-friendly climate-friendly housing and communities and clean innovation.

Dr. Michael Moffat, addresses the meeting attendees and thanked Mr. Taylor for the warm welcome. He presented, Housing Update: Markham, which provided an overview of:

- The province's housing start target;
- The actual housing start level required to meet the current and future needs;
- Expected population growth in Ontario;
- The reasons why young families are leaving Ontario;
- The definition of housing affordability and whether it is a crisis; and,
- The challenges associated with building new homes.

The following discussion ensued after the presentation:

- An inquiry regarding the top three things that Canada can do to solve the issues associated with building new homes;
- The likelihood that climate change issues will be exacerbated with this volume of construction;
- The impact on foreign students arriving ill prepared to live in the province;
- Housing as a Human Right;
- That there should be a limit to the number of homes that can be purchased;
- That there is a need to build purposeful rental housing and social housing;
- The use of modular construction to assist in meeting the set housing targets;
- The demographic components and reasons that people are leaving Ontario for Alberta;
- An inquiry regarding why an apparently unachievable target was established:
- The challenges surrounding building new homes in rural communities, and use of infrastructure outside the community that residents there do not contribute to; and,
- The effect of climate change on newbuilds.

Dr. Moffat noted that all levels of government are required to work together to create policies, incentives and provide funding to address the challenges around the need and affordability of housing.

The Chair thanked Dr. Moffat on behalf of Members of Council and attendees for the informative presentation and for attending this meeting.

7.1.2 PRESENTATION & WORKSHOP: REVIEW OF BMFT GOAL 3

Bryan Frois, Senior Manager, Executive Operations & Strategic Initiatives, and Meg West, Consultant, facilitated the Building Markham's Future Together, Goal #3 review.

There was constructive discussion to make adjustments to the outlined strategic plan inclusions that align to current City concerns and objectives.

7.1.3 PRESENTATION & WORKSHOP: REVIEW OF BMFT GOAL 4

Bryan Frois, Senior Manager, Executive Operations & Strategic Initiatives, and Meg West, Consultant, facilitated the Building Markham's Future Together, Goal #4 review.

There was constructive discussion to make adjustments to the outlined strategic plan inclusions that align to current City concerns and objectives.

Staff were requested to develop a value statement to publicly communicate the City's narrative and to identify whether age-friendly concepts require defining. Additionally, staff were requested to outline the current youth engagement initiatives and to identify ways to increase collaboration with the City's youth going forward.

Mr. Frois and Ms. West will review the considerations from today's session to revise the overall plan. The next steps include a public meeting on November 22, 2023 and public survey that will be used to assist in identifying any missing elements.
