





Comparison of 19-Year Average Tax Rate Increase (2006-2024)




A Strong Markham BUDGET 2024 Residential Tax Paid – City Share

2 Storey Home Residential Tax - City Share Only



Low-income Seniors Support

- New in 2024, Markham is introducing a new program to help keep seniors healthy and aging in place.
- The Low-Income Seniors Property Tax Assistance Program will support low-income seniors with an interest free repayment plan to help them clear their tax arrears.
- Once arrears are addressed, seniors will be registered in the existing Seniors Property Tax Deferral Program.

- \$2.2M Customer Relationship Management system to modernize and improve customer service provided by the Contact Centre and City departments
- \$1.1M City website and new mobile capability upgrades



Inclusive Markham

Inclusive Markham

- \$2.8 million in 2024 will fund upgrades and improve accessibility in parks and playgrounds to meet AODA requirements
- In 2024, the Multi-Year Accessibility Plan will be refreshed to improve accessibility in the City
- The City and Destination Markham Corporation will co-host the 50th anniversary of the Little Native Hockey League (LNHL) 2024 Hockey Tournament



The proposed tax rate increase of **2.99%** represents an increase of ~\$40 for the average residential property

Excellence Through Efficiency and Effectiveness (E3)

Cumulative Savings and Revenue Enhancements to date: \$35.6M



2024 Savings and Revenue enhancements to date \$0.2M

Cumulative Savings of \$23.8M and Revenue enhancements of \$11.7M = Total to date \$35.6M

Total Savings and Revenue enhancements of \$35.6M – equates to tax rate increase avoidance of 28.12%


Markham customers pay a rate per cubic meter for water use. As per the

Region Wholesale Rate - Nearly 70% of the water rate.

chart, the rate consists of 4 components:

- Non-Revenue Water Water lost through water main breaks.
- Operating Expenditures Operation and maintenance of Markham's local water and wastewater systems
- Reserve Contributions Looking ahead 25 years to set aside funds for Local system replacements and rehabilitations,

Taking all these into consideration, the 2024 increase is **3.54%** which represents an increase of **\$35.26** for the average Markham home.
