Summary of Management Review	<ul> <li>Presentation provided to Top Management covered all required items identified in the Operational Plan and Drinking Water Quality Management Standard v.2 (DWQMS v.2).</li> <li>Top Management focused on the review of information from July 1 to December 31, 2023.</li> <li>QMS performance was reviewed to confirm that the system continues to be suitable, adequate and effective.</li> </ul>
Deficiencies Identified	No deficiencies were identified at this meeting.
Decisions Made	Environmental Services can organize a tour to the Duffin Creek Water Pollution Control Plant for staff, Council and senior management in 2024.
Action Items	<ol> <li>Provide a Briefing Note to update Top Management on the status of development, watermain, and water quality maintenance in the Langstaff area.</li> <li>Provide a Briefing Note to update Top Management on the New Development inspection practices and identify any improvements.</li> <li>Inform the Recreation project team and Director Creighton to ensure they partner with York Region to design the McCowan Reservoir site adequately for long-term recreational use and parking demands.</li> <li>Update relevant procedures to include new criteria for staff to enter homes versus conducting remote investigations and resolutions, with the goal of optimizing performance and customer service.</li> <li>Director Wu will provide an update to Commissioner Jones after meeting with ITS to discuss how to address the backlog issue.</li> <li>Update the watermain inventory table to include the total length of each type of pipe material.</li> </ol>
Other QMS Issues Identified	<ul> <li>It has been ten years since a facility tour of Duffin Creek Water Pollution Control Plant was provided to staff. Councilors and senior management will also be offered this opportunity, with an optional invitation to be sent.</li> <li>The City received an updated Municipal Drinking Water License (MDWL, issue 11) on October 17, 2023 to include a four-year extension for leading sampling relief.</li> </ul>
