

By-law 2014-39

A By-law to provide for early (advance) voting to be held prior to Voting Day for the 2014 Municipal Election

Whereas section 43(1) of the <u>Municipal Elections Act</u>, 1996 provides that a municipal council shall enact a by-law to establish one or more dates for advance voting and the hours during which voting places shall be open on that date(s);

Whereas on November 20, 2012, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Markham passed By-law 2012-239 authorizing the use of Optical Scanning Vote Tabulators and Vote Recorders for the 2014 Municipal Election and By-law 2012-238 authorizing the use of Internet Voting during the early voting period of the 2014 Municipal Election;

Now therefore, the Council of the Corporation of the City of Markham enacts as follows:

- 1. An in-person early vote shall be held on Friday, October 17, 2014 between the hours of 10:00 AM and 8:00 PM at the following location:
 - Markham Civic Centre, 101 Town Centre Blvd
- 2. An in-person early vote shall be held on Saturday, October 18, 2014 and Sunday, October 19, 2014 between the hours of 10:00 AM and 8:00 PM at the following locations:
 - Thornhill Community Centre
 - Markham Civic Centre
 - Varley Art Gallery
 - Markham Museum
 - Cornell Community Centre
 - Angus Glen Community Centre
 - Parkland Public School
 - Milliken Mills Community Centre
- An in-person early vote shall be held on Monday, October 20, 2014 through Thursday, October 23, 2014 between the hours of 10:00 AM and 8:00 PM at the following locations:
 - Markham Civic Centre
 - Thornhill Community Centre
 - Armadale Community Centre
 - Cornell Community Centre
- 4. An on-line (internet) early vote shall be held on Friday, October 17, 2014 starting at 9:00 AM EST and ending at 12 midnight EST on Thursday, October 23, 2014.

Read a first, second, and third time and passed on March 25, 2014.
