Dear Mayor and Council,

Since 2005, Waste & Environmental Management and Operations Dept have initiated several annual spring cleanup programs, such as 20 Minute Makeover, Adopt-a- Park and Pitch-in Canada.

The 20 Minute Makeover began as an invitation from the Mayor of Toronto to all GTA municipalities to participate in a scheduled cleanup on a designated day at a specific time. This event also had sponsors who contributed supplies as well as distribution locations. Residents were asked to register their cleanup with the city via the Contact Centre and pickup their supplies prior to the cleanup day. Although very successful, this program limited residents, schools and community groups to the scheduled time and in some cases discouraged participation.

Also participating in community spring cleanup events, the Operations Dept organizes Adopt-a- Park programs involving many community groups. These events take place throughout the warmer weather months across the city.

Waste & Environmental Management and Parks Dept propose that April 2013, be proclaimed as "Keep Markham Beautiful" month. Working together, the City departments will organize procurement, distribution of supplies and the collection of waste and recycling. In this way, allowing residents, schools, community groups to participate in beautifying Markham at a time convenient for the individual group.

Ontario Marks World Autism Awareness Day by Raising the Flag in 444 Communities Across the Province

February 15, 2013 (Toronto, ON) - April 2nd, 2013 will mark an historical day in Canada for the Autism community. For the first time, Canadians will recognize World Autism Awareness Day.

All Ontario municipalities are being asked to Raise the Flag in honour of this historic day. Autism Ontario will send all 444 municipalities the World Autism Awareness Day flag thanks to the generous support of BMO. Communities are being asked to raise the flags at noon on April 2nd, 2013 at all City and Town Halls across the province to raise awareness of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and encourage support and inclusiveness for individuals with ASD.

"This is a monumental day for the Autism community," said Margaret Spoelstra, Executive Director of Autism Ontario. "Autism Spectrum Disorder is something for which many Ontarians require support. Children and adults with ASD typically have difficulties in verbal and non-verbal communication, social interactions, and leisure or play activities.

- 2. Mayors will be contacted in mid February directly by a representative from Autism Ontario. There are 22 Coordinators in ON who will be contacting municipalities. Please work with these people and Autism Ontario volunteers in order to make the event a big success in your community... (there is no need to respond to this email at this time).
- 3. Your leadership, as elected representatives will make a difference. 20% of all students in ON have a learning disability. Many of them have Autism, ADHD, FASD, etc. Ultimately you want them to develop into TAXPAYERS, not dependants on society. How they and their families are supported in the community makes a world of difference. You will make a difference.

We have met at FCM and AMO conferences over the past 16 years, first through my role as Director Business Development with the FCM and for the past 10 years through my involvement with Municipal World. During this time I have engaged many of you in discussions about Autism.

Among you there are parents, grandparents, etc. with individuals in your families who have Autism. For those of you who have this connection, you know that the support of the community is so very important. "It takes a village to raise a child." My son, who has Asperger's Syndrome, is in his third year of university. My brother had Autism and lived nearly all his life institutionalized at great expense to government.

At the **AMO Annual Conference** in August, the Autism Ontario flag raising effort was brought forward at the time **Kathleen Wynne**, as Minister of Municipalities, addressed all of you. I have worked with people like Kathleen and John Tory for years to help increase awareness and services for people with ASD. John is Hon. Chair for <u>Unity for Autism</u>.

The flags have been generously paid for by the Bank of Montreal. My friend Jim Kelsey is a senior executive with the Bank and he is on the Board of the Geneva Centre for Autism, an Ontario Government funded support agency. Jim has an adult son and grandson with Asperger's. BMO's involvement in the "Raise the Flag" initiative is a

continuation of their years of generosity and support to make life better for ASD individuals and their families in Ontario.

WAAD is now recognized by the Government of Canada through the efforts of Mike Lake MP (Edmonton) whose teenage son has Autism. All elected officials will want to see the following video...an MP making a real difference.

Good Afternoon Stephen,

On behalf of Councillor Moretti, I am writing you today to request that the City of Markham proclaim April 5th, 2013 as National Caregiver Day.

In Canada, April 5th marks a day of celebration and acknowledgement for caregivers and their important roles in providing ongoing care and assistance for family and friends who are in need of support as a result of cognitive, physical or mental health conditions. These care giving roles are provided without pay, and are often taken on by spouses, partners or children. National Caregiver Day was incepted in order to acknowledge such caregivers throughout Canada and raise greater awareness, support and resources for this growing group of informal care providers.

Up until 2011, it appears that National Caregiver Day, formerly Family Caregiver Day, has largely been an informal celebration among caregivers, support groups and several palliative care organizations. As a result of national awareness campaigns by caregiver associations and support groups, the first National Caregiver Day was celebrated in 2012 throughout Canada. For this year's National Caregiver Day, associations such as the Canadian Hospice Palliative Care Association and the Canada Cares Resource Network, have chosen to focus on and acknowledge the challenges faced by caregivers in caring for people with dementia. On April 5th, various online tools, forums and events will take place geared towards care giving and dementia, as well as celebrate numerous caregivers across Canada for all that they do.

In order to recognize the numerous families throughout Markham impacted by the work of informal caregivers, we are requesting that April 5th, 2013 be proclaimed National Caregiver Day. We hope that by the City of Markham's endorsement of this national campaign, caregivers throughout the City will gain the recognition they deserve, as feel support from the community in which they live.

REQUEST FOR PROCLAMATION OF PERSIAN NEW YEAR

WHEREAS Nowruz is a significant celebration which symbolizes the changing of the seasons by marking the first day of spring, the renewal of life, and the beginning of the New Year in the Iranian calendar.

WHEREAS Nowruz originated in Iran 3000 years ago, and is observed by Iranians as well as people from Iraq, Azerbaijan, Kurdistan, Uzbekistan, Turkmenistan, Tajikistan, Afghanistan and parts of northwest India and China.

While its roots are in the Zoroastrian religion, Nowruz is celebrated by people of many different faiths. Each culture and community has its own traditions, and all gather with family and friends for celebrations, which include an elaborate traditional table setting of seven specific items beginning with the letter 'S', known as Haft Sin, that signify life, health, wealth, abundance, love, patience and purity. Gathered around the Haft Sin table, families count down to the New Year, offer prayers for health, happiness and prosperity and serve the delicacies prepared for the occasion; and,

WHEREAS on April 10, 2008, MPP Reza Moridi introduced a motion in the Legislature at Queen's Park proclaiming the first day of spring as Nowruz Day in Ontario which was passed unanimously by the Legislative Assembly of Ontario, recognizing the first day of Spring as Nowruz.

WHEREAS In 2009, the Canadian parliament by unanimous consent passed a bill to add Nowruz to the national calendar of Canada. The *Inter-governmental Committee for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Heritage of the United Nations*, officially registered Nowruz on the *UNESCO List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity*. This was followed by the UN's General Assembly in 2010 recognizing the *International Day of Nowruz; and*,

WHEREAS the Persian community continues to contribute significantly to Markham's social, economic, political and cultural life; and,

WHEREAS Markham is Canada's most culturally diverse city taking immense pride in engaging its vibrant communities and promoting intercultural understanding, mutual respect, and universal acceptance; and,

WE HEREBY PROCLAIM the first day of spring as Persian New Year in the City of Markham and extend warm greetings to all those of Persian origin in our City on this important occasion.
