The Environmental Issues Committee, Waste Diversion Sub-Committee, Waste Diversion Workshop convened at 9:05 a.m. with Deputy Mayor Jack Heath as Chair.

#### **1.** Adoption of the Minutes

## 2. Re Cap of Workshop # 2

Dave Douglas, VsionQuest Consulting reviewed the key points from Workshop No. 2. Some of which included:

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- Clear garbage bag benefit is to removing hazardous waste from the garbage;
- Ensure sufficient funding for annual Mission Green newsletter;
- Need to focus on homes currently not participating in waste management's 3 stream program;
- Need for program to reduce single use plastic plates and utensils;
- Address the processing challenges and issues at the York Region Recycling Facility;
- Eliminate the exchange fee charge for replacing a damaged recycling bin;
- Reducing use of privacy bags in clear bag; reducing the availability of colored bags at retail outlets in Markham;
- Adding the multi-residential buildings currently receiving tax grant in lieu of collection services to city collection program (could save approximately \$100K per year);
- Requiring new developments to have three chute systems and for all buildings to maintain their tri sorter systems.

## 3. Waste Management Program and Service Review Workshop # 3

Dave Douglas continued the workshop on Markham's waste management program.

### Multi Residential

Information was provided outlining the status of all Markham's multi-residential buildings.

The Committee continued its discussion on diversion in multi-residential buildings. The following feedback was provided:

- Buildings should be operated as recycling center's for items such as batteries/furniture/textiles;
  - A designated representative or the Property Manager can be responsible for the drop off of batteries;
  - o Should pick up textiles from all multi-residential buildings;
- Need to be tough and consistent in conditions and requirements for following diversion program objectives;
- Improvements should be made at the development stages whenever possible.

## Recycling Depots

The following feedback was provided on Recycling Depots:

- Do we know how far residents are willing to travel to a recycling depot; is there a need for more locations in newer sections of Markham;
- Exchange fee for damaged recycling bins should be eliminated;
- Inquired if retailers could sell "Markham" recycling bins;
- Would like to expand to e-waste donation opportunities;
- Depots should have a consistent image across Markham;
- Need to open waste depots in the future urban area (North West) and in the North East.

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## <u>Textiles</u>

The following feedback was provided on the City's Textiles program:

- Have 7 smart bins and 133 steel bins owned by charitable partners;
- Civic Center (outdoor) & Pan Am Centre only large Community Facilities that do not host a textile box;
- Other municipalities are learning from Markham with respect to its textile program; receiving calls from across Canada
- Need to have a Licensing Hearing to address final vendor appeal;
- Finalizing agreement for Textile bins at Markham GO Stations;
- Should look into revamping sensors on Smart Bins;

The Committee requested that a Licensing Hearing regarding the removal of the bins be held in November. It also requested that a chart be presented at the next meeting with the location of the non-charitable and charitable textile bins in Markham.

It was noted that the charity B'nai Brith Canada has requested to have bins in Markham. The Committee approved the charity.

## Polystyrene Densifier

- Depot system ensures styrofoam comes in clean and has a market;
- Consider banning packaging styrofoam at the curb so that it can be recycled;
- Need to enforce the Zero Waste Policy at City facilities;
- Explore banning or having stricter rules (like using paper products) around single use plates and utensils at restaurants.

## Leaf and Yard Waste

- Need to educate residents on natural options like mulching their leafs;
- Request to explore vacuuming the leaves from the curb in leafy areas.

## Super Mailboxes

- Having recycling bins at super mailboxes helps keep the area neat and tidy;
- Now use a different colour recycling bin to discourage theft of the bins;
- Ward 4 super mailboxes currently do not have recycling bins,
