#### 5.0 GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT - ITEMS ARISING

- Bill 148 expected to cost us +\$150K for the first year
- not increasing rental rates much, just staff rates and new rates for summer camps
- another spectacular rental year; revenues increased despite being closed for renovations
- still improving Front-of-House to provide better service levels
- staff morale and motivation much improved
- new projector and screen; looks spectacular
- only 1 person needed to set up the screen
- capital projects on track
- ECEY went well
- Interkom taking over marketing during the transition period
- being very well handled; they have a lot of skills so more effective and efficient
- they have a lot of internal resources; at least 3 people working on our account
- a lot of motivation for them to do a good job
- December shows, Brass Transit, Nikki Yanofsky, Masters of Illusion, sold out
- over all, a stellar year despite the shutdown and challenges

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#### 6.0 PRIORITY ITEMS - PRESENTATION AND DISCUSSION

#### 6.1 <u>2017 Discovery Gala Roundup</u>

- silent auction was re-evaluated and did better this year
- a lot of challenges were addressed
- wine cork idea sold out in minutes
- art work cards done by UHS students didn't work out as well as hoped
- Patrick O'Hanlon was missed at the silent auction
- challenge to get a lot of stuff done during the dinner, i.e. awards, auction, dinner
- review how we do awards not at the dinner?
- give them a higher profile during the gala
- winners were very happy with the awards
- if the dinner were held at the Hilton, could be more people
- people were pleasantly surprised by Kiefer Sutherland's performance and how good he was, but sales were disappointing
- when sending out thank you letters, send out a certificate which shows their contribution to the community
- the dinner itself was excellent

#### 6.2 2018 Gala Date and Dinner Location:

- thanks to Justin for the financial assistance
- Blue Rodeo giving back \$25K of the performance fee
- a little hurdle with the location the Civic Centre not available due to the election
- if can't use the Great Hall, then
  - o dinner at Hilton and show here, or
  - have reserved the Great Hall space at UHS for dinner, and show here,
     or; space bigger than here but need to be able to dress the room; also
     need a special occasion permit, which may be against Board policy, or
  - o change the date, which might be tricky for the artist to do, or
  - o all at the Hilton; very expensive but could have more people; question is can we really sell more tables?
- have to find a new co-chair
- was difficult to sell tables without Patrick
- what's our obligation re travel between event venues if serving alcohol?
- if at the high school, use Discovery as the hook for having it there
- need to decide soon
- what about a tent?
- need to narrow down the options
- if before the election all politicians might attend

#### 6.3 Funding of Foundation Start-up:

- City said can set up a Foundation and the Legal Department will give support but probably not done any time soon
- were told money can't be used from the endowment fund
- go to an outside legal firm to do pro bono work
- build governance from scratch; look at Kingston model
- also going to talk to the Hospital board

- City vs. private foundation ask the Mayor to be that person
- sending an e-mail to the City to get them more interested
- use Blue Rodeo's \$25K to partially fund?
- will the City allow us to do it?
- position the Gala as a launch for the Foundation
