PURPOSE:

The purpose of this report is to request approval for business travel for Sandra Tam, Senior Business Development Officer, to Hong Kong and Shenzhen from May 16 to 20 to participate in the Canadian Trade Mission for the "Belt and Road" Summit and additional programs.

Business missions are an integral part of Markham's 10-Year Economic Strategy, "Markham 2020". By participating in the Canadian Trade Mission, Markham gains the benefits of building international business relations, which may lead to increased investment and trade opportunities for Markham. It also addresses the objective of building Global Markham and Branded Markham.

OPTIONS/ DISCUSSION:

About the "Belt and Road Initiative":

"The Silk Road Economic Belt and the 21st century Maritime Silk Road", also known as the "Belt and Road Initiative" is a development strategy, framework, and cooperation priorities adopted by the People's Republic of China in October 2013 to enhance regional connectivity and embrace economic growth. This initiative is designed to boost economic, trade, investment and other ties to 65 countries across Asia, Europe and Africa, covering 63% of the world's population. It offers unprecedented business opportunities in sectors such as infrastructure, transportation, logistics, financing and investment during the early phases of the initiative. It is designed to identify opportunities for companies to promote products and services to these markets. Canadian companies are invited to capitalize on these possibilities through partnership with the Super Connector: Hong Kong.

About the Trade Mission:

The Canadian Trade Mission to Hong Kong for the "Belt and Road" Summit from May 16-20 is organized by the Hong Kong Trade Development Council (HKTDC), in partnership with the Hong Kong Economic and Trade Office (HKETC) in Canada.

It is supported by the Association of Chinese Canadian Entrepreneurs, Confederation of Greater Toronto Chinese Business Association, Hong Kong Canada Business Association, Ontario Chamber of Commerce, Brampton Chinese Business Association, ITS Canada, the City of Calgary and the City of Markham.

Objectives of the Mission:

The Mission is designed to facilitate Canadian participants to leverage the inaugural "Belt and Road" Summit and the additional programs to:

- Obtain first-hand market intelligence of the Belt and Road initiative from international thought-leaders, senior ministers from countries along the Belt and Road, and world-renowned business leaders;
- Explore potential business opportunities in the markets covered by the Belt and Road Initiative and make informed decisions on strategies and business plans; and
- Meet new contacts, potential partners and clients.

Invited Participants:

Businesses and professionals from the following sectors have been invited to participate in the trade mission:

- Banking and Financial Services
- Logistics and Maritime Services
- Professionals Services: lawyers, accountants, business management consultants, etc.
- Infrastructure Development: developers, engineers, architects, planners and contractors.
- Cross-border Investment: senior executives of sovereign wealth funds, institutional investors, entrepreneurs, CFOs and finance directors of conglomerates.

- International Trade and Manufacturing: supply chain management professionals, owners and operators of industrial zones, industrialists, traders
- Governments and Institutions: senior officials in economic development, representatives from finance and commerce ministries, trade and investment promotion agencies, academic scholars and researchers.

The Canadian Trade mission is led by Robert Armstrong, President of the Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport – North America and Past National Chair, Hong Kong-Canada Business Association. As of March 17, a total of 22 delegates have already registered (Attachment A – Delegation List).

Due to the broadened engagement with the Hong Kong Trade Development Council (HKTDC) during Markham's previous business missions to China, in January 2016, Markham was invited by HKTDC, the organizer of the "Belt and Road" Summit, to participate (Attachment B – HKTDC Invitation Letter). As a token of appreciation of the partnership between HKTDC and Markham, HKTDC will waive the summit registration fee of US\$200 for one Markham staff.
