1. MINUTES OF THE MARKHAM CYCLING & PEDESTRIAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON NOVEMBER 20, 2014

2. STANDING ITEMS FROM 2014 BUSINESS PLAN

Catchbasin Grates and Cyclist Safety

Staff advised that they have contacted the City's operation staff and that an inventory of the catchbasins with grates that are not bike-friendly will be done in the spring when the grate are being cleaned out. Staff indicated that they will forward the pictures of the areas that have double grates. The Committee suggested staff provide a timeframe of when the inventory will be completed.

Cycling on Sidewalks

There was discussion regarding whether cycling on sidewalks should continue to be considered by the Cycling & Pedestrian Advisory Committee. A vote was taken indicating that the majority of members favoured continued discussion of this item at the January meeting. Staff suggested that the City's legal department and by-law enforcement should be consulted on this matter.

It was suggested that the proposed motion relative to permitting cyclists on sidewalks be considered at the January meeting.

Project-Specific EA's/Design

Staff advised that the Community Liaison Committee is already looking into naming the MUP from 16th Avenue to Bob Hunter. It was noted that a report referencing this will be considered at the January 27, 2015 Development Services Committee meeting.

Neighbourhood Walkability Audit

The Committee was advised that the Walkability Audit subcommittee decided to go with People Space Workshop, Paul Young. Staff advised that Mr. Young has refined his proposal and that the revised proposal will forwarded to the subcommittee members for their Cycling & Pedestrian Advisory Committee December 18, 2014 Page 3 of 5

comments/input. Staff confirmed that the grant cheque in the amount of \$10,000 from Healthy York has been received. It was noted that the funds will be used for the walkability audit and that the funds must be used prior to March 31, 2015.

David Rawcliffe advised that an e-mail was sent out to all Members of CPAC to vote on suggested places to perform the walkability audit. The following are the top five locations:

- 1. Thornhill Community Centre
- 2. Woodbine Power Centre (Hwy7/Woodbine area)
- 3. Unionville GO/PAN AM Centre
- 4. Markville Mall
- 5. Boxgrove Plaza/Copper Creek Drive

The Committee suggested having Paul Young present the results of the walkability audit to CPAC in May 2015.

Surface Type for MUP and Cycle Tracks

The Committee discussed the different types of surface materials used for MUP's, such as asphalt over concrete, and suggested that representatives from the City's operation staff and York Region's operation staff present at a future CPAC meeting and explain how the surface materials are determined.

Baseline Metrics

Joe Doria and Taskin Shirazi presented the results of the Metrics Survey.

Shawn Smith, York Region advised that he will provide CPAC with some data they have collected. He indicated that York Region will be doing a phone survey to obtain information relative to cyclists within York Region. The Committee advised that they have four questions that the committee members came up with which were intended to be used in a Markham survey. Peter Miasek will send those questions to Shawn for consideration during their phone survey, as per the CPAC minutes of September 22, 2011.

Gap Subcommittee

Peter Miasek advised that the gap subcommittee members have met and that 17 gaps have been identified and they are developing action plans for each. The subcommittee intends to meet monthly and update CPAC after their next meeting.

Dan Gillian advised the Committee that he has reviewed the City's Cycling Master Plan and spoke in support of the plan, but that there should be a greater emphasis on gap filling to achieve a planned network.
