



Transit ridership and support is building

- > Viva ridership has increased by 38% [since launch 2005 – 2013]
- > Transit mode share is shifting in York Region and is currently at 11%
- > Continued public support for investment in public transit – 79% of residents support a connected transit network
- > Since amalgamation transit ridership grew from 7 million in 2005 to 22.7 million in 2013

project status – utility relocation

- > Highway 7 – major utility relocations are now complete
- > South Town Centre, Cedarland and Warden – utility relocations will be complete by Q2



project status – structures

- > Apple Creek Bridge – widening 95% complete
- > Warden Avenue Bridge – widening 90% complete




project status – road works

Road widening will be completed for the rest of the rapidway:

- Highway 7 – Woodbine Avenue to South Town Centre
- South Town Centre, Cedarland and west side of Warden Avenue
- This work includes: boulevards, lighting & traffic signals

Traffic Staging:

- Highway 7 – paving until opening in August
- South Town Centre – reduced to 1-lane per direction for duration of road widening
- Cedarland – remains closed until August 2014
- Warden – rolling lane closures



communication is a top priority during construction



During construction signage plays a key role and includes the following:

- Variable message boards
- On street directional and business open signs
- Pedestrian detours and safety messages
- Traffic and wayfinding signs

construction milestones

- Complete Highway 404 to Warden [5 stations]
- Complete utility relocations on South Town Centre, Cedarland, Warden – Q2
- Complete bridge widening (Apple Creek & Warden) – Q3/Q4
- Complete boulevard, road work, lighting & traffic signals – Q4
- Fully operational Hwy 404 to Warden/Enterprise Station – December 2014




rapidways open in Markham this year!

Viva service operations launched in two phases -

- Phase 1 – Hwy 404 to South Town Centre [4 stations] – opening in August
- Phase 2 – South Town Centre to Warden Station [2 stations] – opening in December




> Service launch – *be moved*

- > Safety and education are key messages for both pedestrians and motorists



Markham Centre [H3.4] 2015 – 2019

vivavnext



- > Defining the scope of work in Markham Centre to include in the H3.4 bundle RFP including:
 - > Birchmount Road to Sciberras Road cross-section and alignment coordinated with the City and developer plans
 - > Intersection of Simcoe Promenade and Enterprise Boulevard interim configuration designed to ensure safe operation of rapidway and to minimize potential of vehicles entering the rapidway
 - > Single lane eastbound rapidway on YMCA Boulevard and a receiving lane on Kennedy Road
 - > Property requirements and acquisition process
 - > Construction agreement and maintenance agreement

Markham Centre [H3.4] – timeline



- > Request For Qualifications – closed on February 25, 2014
- > Request For Proposals scheduled to be released – June 2014
- > Request For Proposals scheduled to close – November 2014
 - > Financial close – April 2015
- > Construction scheduled to begin – Fall 2015 (after 2015 Pan American and Parapan American Games)
 - *note schedule is subject to change after the contract is awarded
- > Construction completion 2019
