The Senior Heritage Planner provided an update on two of the vacant heritage buildings being investigated by By-law Enforcement staff. The owners have done some work to secure the buildings and have submitted Engineering opinions that the buildings are not restorable. A peer review has been requested by City staff, and a site visit by staff and members of the Heritage Markham Committee will be organized in the near future.

Barry Martin and Marion Mathias expressed an interest in this matter and indicated the following week would be best time for the site visit.

15. Site Plan Control Application

Proposed Additions and Re-Cladding of Existing House

146 John Street, Thornhill (16.11)

File Number: SC 13 138084

The Heritage Planner gave an overview of the proposed addition and modifications to an existing dwelling at 146 John Street and summarized staff's comments regarding roof-top decks, the front veranda, and other details.

A representative of the applicant made a deputation and provided additional information, advising of the proposed dimensions of the veranda, preferring a width of at least five feet. Staff advised that this may require a Minor Variance application and noted that the Committee can authorize waiving the fee if it is a result of a recommendation of the Committee. The Committee encouraged a larger porch to suit the building design and supported waiving the fee.

The representative provided a sample photo of a sunroom similar to the proposed addition for illustration purposes and confirmed that the railing along the roofline will be two feet high and is for aesthetic purposes – it will not be used as a rooftop deck. He also confirmed that a similar railing on the north elevation would also be decorative and at the same height.

The Committee had questions regarding the windows, materials and colours. The applicant responded that vinyl windows, white wood cladding and cobblestone stonework would be used, and that the two-over-two windows will have external muntin bars. The Committee encouraged the use of wood windows.

The Committee indicated support for the proposal and the improvements for this house, and discussed a safety concern for the enclosure of part of the chimney, the addition of external muntin bars, and the appropriate proportions of the windows including the large plate glass window shown on the west elevation. Staff raised the issue of the accuracy of the elevation drawings and the need for correction.

The applicant offered to forward a 3D rendering of the entire building to the Committee. Councillor Valerie Burke and Marion Matthias requested to view the final drawings prior to approval.

The Committee expressed appreciation for the efforts of the applicant.

Heritage Markham Recommends:

That Heritage Markham has no objection to the proposed additions, new veranda and recladding of the existing house at 146 John Street subject to staff/applicant clarifying and rectifying the outstanding issues identified on January 8, 2014 and undertaking the necessary revisions to the drawings to ensure they are accurate; and,

That the applicant enter into a Site Plan agreement with the City containing the standard conditions regarding colours, materials, windows, etcetera; and,

That final review of the Site Plan application SC 13 138084 be delegated to Heritage Section Staff; and further,

That Heritage Markham endorse waiving the fees for any Committee of Adjustment applications required with respect to the veranda width.

That Heritage Markham supports any application by the owner to the City's 2014 Designated Heritage Property Grant Program for appropriate wood windows provided that the eligibility requirements for the program are met.

The Heritage Planner presented the proposed logo design for entry and street signs in the Buttonville Heritage Conservation District, and requested feedback. The community will also be consulted for feedback prior to the design going before Council for final approval.

The Committee generally supported the design but questioned if the average viewer would recognize the image as a mill and trees, and suggested it could be simplified. There was no objection to the proposed colour scheme of blue and gold.

Heritage Markham Recommends:

That Heritage Markham supports the logo design and colour scheme for entry signs and street signs in the Buttonville Heritage Conservation District.

Power Outage (16.11)

The Committee acknowledged the dedicated work by City and Powerstream staff in the emergency, and the efforts towards tree preservation.

Site Plan Agreement Compliance

8966 Woodbine Avenue, Buttonville (16.11)

The Senior Heritage Planner provided an update on the restoration of the existing building and new office addition at 8966 Woodbine Avenue in Buttonville. The project was previously supported by Heritage Markham, and the applicant is now asking for the elimination of four window grills. Staff has no objection to the request. It was noted by the Committee that the installation of the barn-like doors is still pending and how important this feature is to the design.

Heritage Markham Recommends:

That Heritage Markham has no objection to the elimination of four window grills on the ground floor for the building at 8966 Woodbine Avenue, Buttonville, on the condition the barn-like doors are installed prior to any release of securities.

The Committee supported the proposal and offered suggestions to include Doors Open Markham properties, potentially organizing the booklet by district, and funding/advertising/printing advice.

Another promotional opportunity was suggested, regarding the upcoming Awards of Excellence ceremony. A Council member offered to approach Corporate Communications for a media release in this regard.

That Heritage Markham supports Ron Waine's proposal to explore the cost and feasibility for a Heritage Markham promotional booklet to celebrate the Committee's 40^{th} anniversary in 2015.
