 - Completed on budget (\$1.7M) and on schedule (November, 2012)




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- Archway request by BIA

- 407 to Hwy 7 phase envisions a gateway feature south of Hwy 7 complimented by landscape improvements in front of the Library.










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



PUBLIC ON-STREET PARKING

EXISTING 85

PROPOSED 63 Includes 4 Designated Accessible Spaces



- Extensive discussion with Accessibility Committee regarding distribution of accessible spaces & path of travel to sidewalk
- Maximum 2hr parking limit may be needed to ensure parking turnover and employees do not utilize public parking
- Need to establish parking business plan for Main Street
- Discussion with property owners to utilize private parking to offset loss of on-street parking







IMPROVED ACCESSIBILITY

- 2.0m wide continuous concrete sidewalks
- 3.om wide continuous concrete crosswalks
- Urban Braille changes in colour and texture to assist people with visual impairment
- Eliminating awkward grade changes in the sidewalk where feasible
- Audible pedestrian signals
- Street names impressed into sidewalk
- Extended boulevard provides furniture zone







FESTIVAL SQUARE PAVING

UNILOCK© - Tri-Colour Blend Paver



- Town Hall[©] series laid in Herringbone pattern within roadway (top left)
- Copthorne[©] series laid in Running Bond pattern in boulevard (bottom left)
- Operations & Maintenance
- Bedding Material to be confirmed
- Final costs to be confirmed







STREET TREES

- All existing trees within the Municipal Right-of-Way will be removed to accommodate a wider sidewalk and streetscaping
- 37 replacement trees are proposed
- Some businesses are requesting trees not be installed in front of their premises
- Tree placement to be finalized subject to Patio Policy (Spring 2013)
- Strata Cell[©] system proposed to facilitate growth and watering




Height/Width – 10m/15m Fall color – Yellow Shape – Open/Pyramidal




Height/Width – 8m/5m Fall color – Insignificant Shape – Compact/Oval

STREET LIGHTS



- Heritage Look
- LED Light Source
- Staff working with lighting expert to confirm dark sky performance
- Banner poles/hanging basket brackets / electrical outlets provided
- Bracket & Lantern can be mounted on existing hydro poles north of Bullock in future phase.





LIMITS OF STREETSCAPING

- Streetscaping will be completed up to the Property Line.
- Property Owners will be provided the opportunity to continue work on Private Property once Main Street Streetscaping is completed.
- City will not be responsible for any work carried out on Private Property
- Existing grade changes within the right-of-way will be addressed if feasible









ISSUES

- Patio Policy
 - Potential impact on sidewalk location and tree installation
- On-Street Parking Spots vs. Patio Space/Bump-Outs
 - Businesses requesting additional bump-out space for potential patio
- Festival Square Paving
 - Extent of paving The original plans showed a decorative treatment at every intersection and was later consolidated to achieve maximum impact at Robinson Street.
 - Cost
- Cost Estimate (\$2.3M) vs. Budget (\$2.3M)







ISSUES

- Archway as Gateway Feature at Highway 7
 - Space for installation has been protected [Potential conflict with utilities unknown]
 - Cost ±\$100,000
 - Archway not identified in previous studies or design guidelines.
 - No heritage precedent for an archway over the street.
- > Extent of Side Street Reconstruction
 - Robinson Street, Wilson Street, Dublin Street, and Centre Street
- Planters and Signs at Festival Square
 - Currently on private property
- Marketing Plan

- Construction Start (July 2013) Tentative
- Construction Completion (November 1, 2013) Tentative
