


2011 Street Hierarchy:

Gold



Streetscape Elements:


- 2m Concrete Sidewalk (min)
- Concrete Strip adjacent to the curb
- Painted Crosswalk

- Street Trees in sod or ground covers
- Markham Centre Lighting poles
- Above ground utility boxes and other elements screened, consolidated, minimized

Gold Streets

Major Collectors, Arterials and Public Transit Routes

Streetscape Elements

Additional enhancements above Silver level:

- treatment adjacent to the curb
- 3m Crosswalk with special treatment
- concrete/natural stone planters with ground cover plantings or, in Tree Grates
- Markham Centre Way Finding signage



Financing Mechanism for Streetscape Upgrades

- Based on earlier Development Charges By-law
- By-law predates Adamson Concept Plan
- Several roads covered for upgrades, but not all
- Current funding formula:
 - 50% Town-Wide/Other Development Charges recoverable
 - 25% Area Specific Development Charges recoverable
 - 25% Non-Growth Share
- Development Charges By-law being updated in 2012
- Will cover all new roads in Markham Centre
