## 4. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

#### A. INFORMATION ON MARKHAM INITIATIVES AND COUNCIL MATTERS

Councillor Valerie Burke advised that MEAC could assist in supporting efforts to prevent turtles from being hit by cars on Persona Boulevard. She also advised that the Public Realm Committee is interested in collaborating with MEAC on future events such as Earth Day. Chair Karl Lyew extended an invitation to the Public Realm Committee to have a seat at future M EAC meetings.

Regional Councillor Joe Li reported that Markham Council is waiting for a decision from Markham District Energy regarding the feasibility of installing the underground waste management system in future developments in Markham.

#### 5. NEW BUSINESS

#### A. PRESENTATION – BRUCE-BERCZY ECOLOGICAL CORRIDOR

Lilli Duoba, Manager Natural Heritage, presented information about the "Bruce-Berczy Ecological Corridor". She advised that ecological corrodors have been part of natural heritage planning in Markham for approximately ten years, originally to protect endangered species and now to integrate development with natural heritage in order to protect the habitat. She noted that there is much senior level government legislative framework and policies directing and guiding Markham's natural heritage planning strategies and initiatives. Markham staff have created a conceptual master plan to guide development of Markham's Future Urban Area, with the exception of the Bruce-Berczy Ecological Corridor. As lands are urbanized, this east-west connection will allow wildlife to move across the land safely and will expand existing wetlands. Strategically located wildlife corridors connect core habitats and support long term survival and sustainability of plant diversity and wildlife. Connected natural heritage lands create more robust and resilient habitats.

## **B. EARTH MONTH PLANNING**

Aamer Mohamed provided an update on plans for Markham's Earth Day celebrations:

- A meeting was held with York University's Dean of Environmental Studies. He is excited to have the school partner with MEAC for this event.
- York University will provide use of its spaces to host environmental seminars on topics such the underground waste management system, ecological corridors, etc., open to the public
- It was suggested the event host keynote speakers, such as noted environmental professors, and a booth staffed by professors and graduate students to engage the community
- It was reported that four members attended the subcommittee meeting on October 25; there was much discussion about the budget required, as well as media and social media opportunities.

Aamer Mohamed noted that it would be important to engage students of all ages. He encouraged the students attending this meeting to become involved and to be leaders at their schools to promote the Earth Day events. The students agreed to connect with Phil Ling, Chair of the Earth Month sub-committee.

For the benefit of guests and new members, Jennifer Wong reviewed the 2017 event and planning details. Aamer Mohammed advised that marketing materials would be developed with the assistance of Markham Corporate Communications staff and asked the students to provide input.

It was agreed to hold the next Earth Month sub-committee meeting on Thursday February 1, 2018 at 7 pm; the meeting was later deferred to February 8, 2018. Jennifer Wong will reserve meeting space at the Civic Centre.
