



City of Markham Section 37 Allocation Policy



Background

- Section 37 of the Planning Act authorizes local municipalities to increase zoned height and/or density of development in return for "facilities, services or matters" and also authorizes the municipality to enter into an agreement with the land owner to secure the benefits
- Markham has had over six years of experience applying Section 37
 provisions of the Planning Act, to secure community benefits in exchange
 for allowing additional height and density for developments
- Section 37 applies to all development requiring a rezoning that increases height and/or density, provided the development is at least 5000 sq m GFA, and the density increase represents at least 1500 sq m GFA over what would otherwise be required

- The Planning Act does not provide much guidance as to how these funds are to be spent, however, Markham's Official Plan indicates that the community benefits should bear a reasonable planning relationship to the increase in height and/or density of the proposed development
- The proposed Section 37 Allocation Policy has a minimum of 60% of Section 37 to remain within the planning area (+500M buffer zone) from where the funds are collected
- The remaining amounts are to directed to City-wide initiatives since increased development has City-wide impacts





The proposed Section 37 Funding Allocation Policy is as follows:

%	Category
20%	City-Wide Public Realm Projects
20%	City-Wide projects already endorsed by Council in principle without an identified funding source (e.g. projects approved in the DC Background study or master plans that aren't fully fundable through Development Charges)
60%	Projects within the planning area of where the Section 37 funds are collected

 Section 37 funds should be used on assets with a goal of minimizing operating costs and maximizing useful life



- Council will approve any projects to be funded through Section 37
