# 3. ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES OF THE MARKHAM ENVIRONMENTAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETINGS HELD ON FEBRUARY 21, 2016

#### 4. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

# **A. INFORMATION ON MARKHAM INITIATIVES AND COUNCIL MATTERS**Deputy Mayor Jack Heath reported that:

- the Provincial Government has requested a review of parks. He also reported that
  Markham is developing a Parks Renaissance strategy which will incorporate a review
  of Markham's parks and facilities and make recommendations for priorities to
  respond to deficits in facilities and supply of park lands; MEAC will be invited to
  comment
- the report regarding the charrette, held in November 2015 to discuss options related to the gateway to the Rouge National Urban Park, will be ready soon
- he will publish a letter on the topic of the possible move of the Buttonville airport to Pickering.

Regional Councillor Joe Li reported that the recent trip to India by Mayor Scarpitti and Councillors was successful. Assistance may be provided to India in the areas of management of waste water and solid waste.

### **B. FOLLOW UP ON ACTION ITEMS**

Chair Diane Ross reviewed and identified the status of the action items.

It was reported that a meeting has been arranged for MEAC members to meet with Mayor Scarpitti on Monday April 11 at 7:00 pm at the Civic Centre; the meeting may last 1-1.5 hours. This is an excellent opportunity for MEAC members to discuss possible projects that Mayor Scarpitti my wish the Committee to develop. Members were asked to prepare questions they night wish to ask.

#### 5. NEW BUSINESS

#### A. EARTH HOUR PLANNING

Councillor Colin Campbell will host an Earth Hour event at Cornell Community Centre on Saturday March 19, 2016. It was suggested that MEAC volunteers arrive at 5:00 pm; Jocelyn Cheung Fanny Luk, and Diane Ross will attend. The MEAC table will be located beside the Sustainability Office table. Karl Lyew provided the MEAC table top information to Fanny Luk for use at the Earth Hour event.

Jennifer Wong asked for volunteers to assist in staffing the Sustainability Office table; Ashok Bangia, Jocelyn Cheung and Diane Ross offered to assist. Diane Ross will promote the Committee's Earth Day event during the MEAC speech.

#### **B. EARTH DAY PLANNING**

Carrie Sally and Jennifer Wong reported that:

- The event would be held on April 23 from 9:30 am − 6:00 pm at CF Markville (Markville Mall) to coincide with the mall's operating hours as requested by mall management
- Carrie Sally and Jennifer Wong will try to have the length of time reduced although exhibitors have advised Jennifer Wong that this is not a problem
- Chuan Li will develop and circulate a schedule of 3-hour shifts for volunteers to sign up .
- Volunteers can talk to attendees about membership on the Committee and Markham environmentally-friendly projects such as waste management and, textile and Styrofoam recycling; Chair Diane Ross will share her speaking points for all to use
- It was requested that a copy of the Greenprint plan be brought so that MEAC members can refer to it and discuss it with attendees
- Carrie Sally will ask Ron Groves for outreach material, particularly the slides used in his recent Plug 'N Drive presentation
- Speeches must be kept to 8 10 minutes in total; Jennifer Wong will confirm that Mayor Scarpitti is attending and will speak; Chair Diane Ross will introduce the Mayor and wrap up the speeches by thanking the exhibitors and mall management
- The space provided for MEAC is circular, which could pose problems for the layout of booths and tables
- Seven exhibitors are confirmed; due to the size of space allotted to MEAC, there may
  be room for only one more exhibitor it was suggested to invite representatives from
  H&M's Textiles Recycling Initiative
- Jennifer Wong will confirm with mall management whether MEAC will be allowed to use a mascot
- Mall management requires that all tables have black tablecloths which Markham staff/MEAC will need to provide
- The budget for the event is \$1200 based on last year's costs; the AV costs will likely be \$800-\$1,000 and each department's share of the event cost is approximately \$420
- It is not likely that Rock the Bike will be available for the event
- It was suggested that MEAC provide food vouchers for exhibitors
- Attendees will be given a "passport", if they visit each exhibitor and have the passport stamped, they will be given a raffle ticket for a prize; it will be confirmed whether Whole Foods might donate a gift basket and whether Markham might donate swim passes
- Karl Lyew provided a sample of a MEAC business card that has been developed; Jennifer Wong will check to see if it can be printed in time for the event
- Jennifer Wong will check to see if the MEAC information sheet will be ready to use as a handout

## C. TEXTILE RECYCLING

The "Tip-of-the-Iceberg: Textile Diversion and EPR Symposium" (TOTIES), organized by VisionQuest Environmental, will be held in Markham at the Hilton Hotel on May 4th, 2016. Claudia Marsales, Senior Manager, Waste & Environmental Management Environmental Services, will speak about the new SMART Textile Diversion Strategy to be introduced later this year. Registration is \$129 per person. Chair Diane Ross will send information about the symposium to Committee members.

#### A. DEPUTY MAYOR'S ANNUAL WALK

Deputy Mayor Jack Heath reported that the Deputy Mayor's Annual Walk will be held during Rouge Days, likely on June 11 or June 12. It was suggested that the walk route might follow the Rouge Valley along Hwy. 48 south to 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue to experience the history of the valley. Karl Lyew will advise TRCA (Toronto and Region Conservation Authority) that MEAC will work with Deputy Mayor Jack Heath to develop the itinerary for the Deputy Mayor's Annual Walk as part of Rouge Days.

#### **B. PROVINCIAL EAC SYMPOSIUM**

It was reported that Jennifer Wong and Karl Lyew plan to attend this event which will be held in Ajax on May 14, 2016. Committee members were asked to advise Jennifer Wong if they also wish to attend. It was suggested that the Committee consider preparing a presentation about its Earth Day event to be delivered at the symposium.

#### C. MARKHAM AGRICULTURAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

Jennifer Wong reported that one seat on this committee is reserved for a MEAC member and it was wondered whether MEAC wished to retain or relinquish this seat.
