4. Accessibility Report Card	<p>Cheryl McConney Wilson provided an update on the City's accessibility initiatives. The City's webpage on accessibility matters was displayed to the Committee. An overview of some of the initiatives the City has undertaken to date to improve accessibility was provided (e.g. Civic Centre enhancements).</p>	

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	<p>The Committee viewed a website created by a Ryerson student called “Access Now”. The website was created as a tool to find accessible places around the world. The data is based on information uploaded by users. The website has been featured in the media and it is being sponsored by various businesses, including TD.</p> <p>The Committee encouraged the City to promote the services it provides to persons with a disability. This was possibly something that the Committee could assist with. The Committee requested that this be added to the next agenda.</p> <p>The Committee inquired whether having Uber operating in Markham impacts the number of accessible cabs. It also questioned if there are will be standards that accessible Uber cabs must follow.
