RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 6) THAT the following Celebrate Markham grants be approved for the **Sport Events Category** (as per Appendix 4):

- 7) THAT Tourism Markham/Information Markham be awarded \$2,500 for website design/content and be aligned with the "Destination Markham" Strategic Initiative by 2017;

- 8) THAT subject to approval by Council, this Staff report showing recommended applications be posted on the Celebrate Markham website for applicant's and the public's information, along with Council's resolution;
- 9) THAT an additional Celebrate Markham application intake be held in April/May 2016 to address transition to the new system for the period October 1, 2016 to March 31, 2017;
- 10) THAT the remaining funds be held until the end of 2016 and be used to assist with transitioning to the revised Celebrate Markham Program, including funding grants resulting from the additional application intake to be held in April/May 2016 and to improve processing applications as noted in recommendation 11 below;
- 11) THAT Staff investigate the use of software and development of an improved website to better manage application processing, as well as improve the efficiency, tracking and reporting on Celebrate Markham applications using remaining 2016 Program funds, or funds identified as part of the 2017 budget process;
- 12) THAT Staff be authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to this resolution.

PURPOSE:

To recommend grants for Celebrate Markham Program for events to be held between April 1, 2016 and March 31, 2017. Recommendations are identified in Attachments 1, 2, 3 and 4.

BACKGROUND:

On October 13, 2015, Council adopted a revised Celebrate Markham Grant Program following a comprehensive program review, which included stakeholder consultations. The first funding cycle took place in Fall 2015, for projects delivered between January 1 and March 31, 2016. At that time, Council considered grant applications in the following categories: Major Community Festivals; Cultural Events and Programs; and Seniors' Clubs. No Sports Event applications were received. Grants totaling \$21,500 were approved and funding was awarded by Council. Cheques have been issued to all successful applicants for the first funding cycle. Remaining funding for the 2nd cycle is \$234,500.

This Staff report contains recommendations for funding successful applicants for projects that take place during the second funding cycle for events delivered between April 1, 2016 and March 31, 2017. The current funding cycle closed on January 7, 2016.

OPTIONS/ DISCUSSION:

A total of 43 applications were received for this funding cycle and based upon evaluation as per Council approved eligibility requirements and program criteria, 34 applications are being recommended for funding (see Attachment 6 Celebrate Markham Program Criteria). All applications received were evaluated by an Interdepartmental Staff Review Committee, including staff from Economic Development, Human Resources, Recreation, Culture and Communications and Community Engagement. Applications were evaluated against the Council-approved Program Criteria and key elements, including:

Organizational Readiness

- Project Merit
- Community Impact
- Partners and Inclusivity
- Waste Planning (Zero Waste Event)
- Workplan
- Project Budget

Application summaries are provided in Attachments 1 to 4, along with the Staff Review Committee's recommendations. The Committee is recommending that 34 applicants be approved, totaling \$137,500 in grants for this funding cycle. The Financial Consideration section of this staff report includes a chart that shows: the amount of funding recommended for the 2nd funding cycle; funds previously approved by Council for the first funding cycle; and remaining Celebrate Markham funds based upon the Staff Committee recommendations. Attachment 5, contains detailed charts showing the amounts approved for each funding category and the recommended recipients.

Application Review

i) More than 1 Application Submitted

Two Celebrate Markham grant applications were received from the Federation of Chinese Canadians in Markham (Taste of Asia and 3 on 3 Hoopfest) for this funding cycle. A grant of \$2,500 was awarded to FCCM in the 1st funding cycle of the new Program for their 2016 Lunar New Year event. FCCM also previously received funding (\$15,000), for the Taste of Asia event held in 2015.

Only one grant can be approved per organization per funding cycle and based on evaluation of the applications submitted, the Staff Review Committee is recommending approval of the Taste of Asia application. 3 on 3 Hoopfest did not qualify for a grant under the Sports Event category as it did not meet the Program criteria and is not a provincially sanctioned event. As with all grant awards under the restructured Celebrate Markham Program, an Outcome/Financial report back on the Lunar New Year event is a prerequisite for release of funds for the Taste of Asia grant.

ii) Tourism Markham

The Tourism Markham grant application could not be evaluated appropriately as it did not fit within the Program criteria (funding was requested for development/maintenance of the existing website). Although the Staff Review Committee is recommending funding in the amount of \$2,500 for 2016/2017, it is further recommended that tourism-related information be transitioned into Markham's own portal environment, managed by the City with related Markham branding, and expanded to include information on tourism on Markham's mobile app as part of the Destination Markham Strategy.

Transition to New Celebrate Markham Program

Few grant applications received by the City were for events to be delivered in the first 3 months of 2017. It appears that applicants may not have been aware of the revised application timeframes. Further, there is a need to continue to raise awareness of the Program to ensure the Program objective of inclusion is met. (The next application intake is mid-September 2016, for events held between April 1, 2017 and March 31, 2018). To ensure those applicants with events planned during the first 3 months of 2017 are able to access grants for their celebrations and events, Staff is recommending to:

- add another application intake in April/May 2016 for existing groups that didn't apply;
- contact applicants that previously held events to inform them of the added opportunity to apply and to raise awareness and better promote the new timelines of the revised program;
- Promote the second intake date to ensure fair access to resources.

Given the increased volume of applications under the new system, Staff recommends investigating use of software, as well as development an improved website to better manage processing of Celebrate Markham applications. This could improve efficiency, enable better tracking of applications and provide easy access to financial and other information for reporting purposes. Remaining 2016 Program funds could be used for this purpose, or, alternatively, funds could be identified as part of the 2017 budget process.

Benefits of the Restructured Program

The restructured Celebrate Markham Program has resulted in numerous positive outcomes which include:

- Significant increase and variety of applications (29 new applicants);
- Allowing new and developing organizations to apply for grants;
- Increasing the number of events and programs held in Markham;
- Potential for encouraging a higher standard of applications over time through education and Program improvement;
- New Sports Event applications being received which have the potential to raise the City of Markham's identity as a sport destination and bring recognition as an active City;
- Organizations becoming more engaged and aware of City goals and plans and aligning their own plans and outcomes to these goals;
- Staff making connections with new organizations for the benefit of the City improving and increasing community engagement/development;

Future Considerations

2017 marks the 150th anniversary of Canada's Confederation. One of the key elements of the Canada 150 Program is "Celebrating & Bringing Canadians Together". To support this, communities across Canada have been invited to create opportunities to celebrate together and build a deeper understanding of Canada, its people and what it means to be a Canadian. This initiative strongly aligns with the

principles of Celebrate Markham and therefore staff will be recommending that funding support for Canada 150 be promoted through the Celebrate Markham Fund in 2017.

Conclusions

The Interdepartmental Staff Review Committee has reviewed all applications, in detail, by fund category, on the basis of the program criteria, as approved by Council. Including the applications from the first funding cycle, a total of 43 applications have been recommended for funding out of the 56 applications received under the revised Celebrate Markham Program to date. Interest in the Program excelled following public communications and The Funder's Forum Program, which was held last December at the Museum, to raise awareness about funding opportunities from various funding organizations, including Celebrate Markham.

Restructuring of this grant program was undertaken to help the City achieve its corporate goals – to increase transparency; to maintain financial sustainability; and to increase community access to the Celebrate Markham grants. As identified at the outset of the review, improving the Celebrate Markham program is dependent upon Council's role being to confirm the Program's goals and objectives, to establish the overall funding envelope and to direct funding requests to the Celebrate Markham Program. Staff's role, meanwhile, is to ensure effective and efficient administration of the Fund according to the established process and criteria. Success of this program depends upon adhering to the revised process which has been put place. Going forward, the Staff Review Committee will incorporate the feedback received and improvements identified through the pilot project for the 2017/2018 funding cycle. Criteria and applications will be adjusted and presented to Council as part of the year end report on Celebrate Markham in Q4 2016.

NEXT STEPS:

Upon approval of the Staff report and funding allocations, staff will follow-up with applicants to inform them of the decisions related to their applications. The next round of applications for 2017/2018 will be open on September 17, 2016. The deadline for the next funding cycle is November 17, 2016. As discussed in this Staff report, it is recommended there be an additional application intake this April/May for the current year allocation 2016/17 as a transition to a new system.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

A total budget of \$256,000 was allocated for Celebrate Markham community applications delivered in January 1, 2016 to March 31, 2017. Of that, \$21,500 was awarded in the 1st funding cycle. A total of \$137,500 is being recommended for distribution to applicants in this current funding cycle, for a total of \$159,000 in grants distributed to the community. The remaining funds (\$97,000) are recommended to be used to assist with transitioning to the new Celebrate Markham Program to the end of 2016. This includes funding grants that would result from an additional application intake held in April/May 2016 for organizations that may have misunderstood the application process under the revised program. This additional intake only covers applications for events and initiatives to be held from October 2016 to March 2017.

The chart below illustrates the fund distribution for the total of \$256,000:

Although there is a surplus remaining for this pilot year of the revised Celebrate Markham Grant Program, Staff do not recommend altering the overall budget, the amount allocated to the each funding cycle, or the caps assigned to each funding category. One of the outcomes set out by Council at the beginning of the Program review was to increase the amount of funding available for new/additional organizations and to provide more opportunities for events, programs, festivals and sporting activities to take place in Markham. Based upon the community response to date, the number of applicants seeking funding support will continue to increase as the Program develops and matures. Also, given the importance of Canada 150 there will be an opportunity to provide support in 2017 for the many events and festivals planned in celebration of Canada's Confederation.

For this initial year, remaining funds should be used to: facilitate a smooth transition to the revised Program and timelines; enable applicants with events planned during the first 3 months of 2017 to access grants as they may not have been aware of the new, revised applications timelines; and to reach out to new groups learning of the Program.

In addition to the \$256,000 identified for community applications, there is \$84,000 allocated to City supported events and initiatives, as well as \$30,000 being held for Kindred Spirits Orchestra (KSO) and an additional \$30,000 held for Markham Arts Council (MAC) as shown below:

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Celebrate Markham Part A: General Criteria - Program Guidelines (All Categories)

PROPOSED ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To make a Celebrate Markham Application:

- Applicants must be a not-for-profit organization, either incorporated or unincorporated;
- Events, activities, and programs must take place in the City of Markham;
- Events, activities and program must not be eligible or funded through other City of Markham funding programs;
- The organization must be supported by a volunteer Board of Directors, Steering Committee or similar body;
- the majority of the organization's Board of Directors must be residents of the City of Markham unless significant community benefits can be demonstrated as part of the application review process;
- Membership in the organization and the organization's activities must be open to the public

Applicants must also meet the criteria for the specific category in which they are applying, detailed in Part B (Attachment 2 to this report):

- 1. Culture Events and Programs
- Major Community Festivals
 Sports Events
- 4. Seniors' Clubs

The following entities are ineligible:

- For-profit organizations;
- Schools, universities, hospitals, daycares, group homes, or any group that has a mandate/activities covered under provincial/federal legislation;
- Political parties and lobby groups;
- Religious groups where services/activities include promotion, or require adherence to a faith (in the event religious services are provided, there must be clear separation between religious and community service functions at event and budget levels);
- National and provincial organizations, unless they have an affiliate club or local chapter within the municipality;
- Grant-making or fundraising organizations;
- Landlord/tenant/condominium corporations;
- Organizations in major deficit or debt positions as a result of financial mismanagement;
- Individuals.

ELIGIBLE EXPENSES

Grants through Celebrate Markham may NOT be used for ongoing operating costs. The following table details eligible and ineligible expenses.

EVALUATION CRITERIA

Successful applications to the Celebrate Markham program must demonstrate the following:

- That the goals and objectives of their event, activity or program align with the Vision and Guiding Principles of Celebrate Markham;
- That their event/activity/program will benefit the community;
- That they have a plan and the staff, support, volunteers and partners to achieve results;
- That they have sound financial management; and,
- That they have other sources of revenue than the City of Markham

All applicants must demonstrate that their event/activity/program etc. will comply with the policies and bylaws of the City of Markham including Zero Waste event policies.

APPLICATION POLICIES

- Applications must be complete and submitted by the Celebrate Markham program deadline;
- Applications must be made through the official application process;
- Only 1 grant award will be made per organization for a 12 month funding cycle;
- Event/activity/program must be completed by the date as stated on the application form, otherwise the funding must be returned;
- Recipients must submit a *Project Outcome/Financial report* for approval at the conclusion of the project and within sixty (60) days. New grant applications will not be accepted unless the *Project Outcome/Financial report* is approved and the organization is in good standing with the City of Markham.

Part B: Detailed Criteria by Category

A. <u>CULTURE EVENTS & PROGRAMS</u> Culture Events & Programs Guidelines:

The goal is to support initiatives that enable Markham residents to participate in activities, events that promote engagement through the arts, heritage and culture.

Who can Apply:

• Groups must have a mandate to provide cultural activities, or customarily provide a cultural activity as part of their services.

Event Eligibility

• Eligible events may include: community theatre productions, choir or band concerts, exhibits, reading or spoken word series, folk arts and craft guild activities and art exhibitions.

Event Criteria and Assessment

Applicants to clearly demonstrate the impact the event will have on culture, the community and tourism in the application

Allocation of Culture Events & Programs funding

- 50% of the Cultural Events & Programs category allocation will be available to:
 - New organizations that have not received funding from Celebrate Markham before;
 - One-time events, activities, initiatives that promote the objectives of the Culture Plan; as determined through the application assessment process.

B. MAJOR COMMUNITY FESTIVALS

i) Major Community Festivals Program Guidelines

The goals are to provide grants for major, community-based festivals and sports events that:

- Have a significant City-wide profile;
- Are capable of attracting visitors from beyond the City of Markham;
- Generate tourism benefits:
- Encourage residents to participate in their community, connect with each other and celebrate the distinct, diverse and dynamic character of the City of Markham;
- Contribute to the vitality of local economies and tourism;
- Raise the profile of the City of Markham as a destination.

Event eligibility:

- Festivals/events must have a primary theme or focus on arts, heritage or culture;
- These festivals and events would be capable of attracting over 10,000 attendees and generally comprise multiple days;
- Demonstrate sources of revenue other than the City of Markham and an appropriate organizational infrastructure.

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Eligible projects include, but are not restricted to: arts festivals, heritage festivals and cultural celebrations, tourism initiatives, and fairs. To be eligible for support, festivals and special events must be open to the general public.

Event criteria and assessment:

Applicant to clearly demonstrate the impact the events will have on culture, the community and tourism in the application.

C. Sports Events

Sport Tourism is the fastest growing grassroots economic development initiative in Canada today. It represents \$3.6B in annual spending and has been shown as a stabilizing force even during an economic downturn. This grant will provide grant opportunities to sport groups to host national, international and regional sport events in our community that will raise Markham's identity as a sport destination and bring recognition for being an active city and people. The Sport Grant supports the Sport Tourism Strategy that the City of Markham is developing.

The goals of the Sport grant program are to:

- Strengthen sport, economic, and community impacts in alignment with the City of Markham Sport Tourism Strategy;
- Generate economic and tourism impacts in the City of Markham and York Region;
- Help communities, organizations, and volunteers enhance their event hosting capacity to attract larger, more prestigious events;
- Build Markham's international profile and reputation as an exceptional major event host; and,
- Support the high performance development pathway for Markham's athletes based on the Canadian sport for Life (CS4L) framework.

Priority of Sport grants are for:

- Provincial and Championships, Regional Events, and invitational Events that clearly fulfill a hosting void in the City;
- Events that fit within the Train to Train, Train to Compete, and Train to Win stages of the CS4L framework:
 - O Consideration may also be given for events in the Active for Life (Masters level) stage, but Masters events are not a primary goal of the Markham sports grants
 - o If applying for a Masters event, be sure to clearly demonstrate the impact the event will have on the sport, community and tourism.

Who Can Apply?

Applications may be submitted by a not-for-profit organization that is operating as a:

 Community organization, club or association, who are registered with a Provincial Sport Organization (PSO) or National Sport Organization (NSO)

Event Eligibility:

An application is eligible for funding only if the grant will be used for event costs for hosting a regional, provincial or national sport event. Additionally, the event <u>must:</u>

- Take place in Markham;
- Be sanctioned by an appropriate, recognized organization (PSO, NSO, International Federation (IF), etc.)

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• Be identified as part of the PSO's and/or NSO's Canadian Sport for life implementation plan.

Funding requests for the following are **NOT** eligible:

- Events that are unconfirmed or still in the bidding process;
- Sports festivals or participation focused events;
- York Region Elementary, Middle, and high School Championship events;
- Hosting multi-sport events (i.e. multi-sport Games);
- Sport development/training camps;
- Provincial, national or international conference, congresses, symposiums, Annual General Meetings, Etc.;
- Capital Expenditures, gifting and prize money.

Event Criteria and Assessment:

To clearly demonstrate the impact the event will have on the sport, community and tourism in the application.

- The event has a defined connection with the sport system (PSO sanctioned and CS4L identified) and provides a valuable competitive opportunity within the high performance development pathway for athletes, coaches and officials;
- The event provides a strong contribution to increasing the capacity of the Municipal, Regional, and Provincial sport system and develops skills and experience of volunteers, technical officials and event organizers;
- The event has the potential to generate measurable economic impacts, tourism benefits, and legacies while providing a valuable sport development opportunity for athletes, coaches and officials;
- There is a significant community support demonstrated for the event and potential for audience reach.

D. SENIORS' CLUBS

The goal is to provide annual funding support to seniors' clubs that deliver social, cultural, physical, recreational and educational activities to senior residents in the City of Markham. These activities reduce isolation and promote social interaction; promote physical and mental well-being; support the participation of seniors in their communities and recognize their contributions and strengthen friendships and community connections.

Eligibility:

- Clubs must be not-for-profit organizations that are open to senior residents of Markham and have a 75% residency rate.
- Clubs must have a mandate to deliver programs and services that benefit seniors in Markham.

Eligible activities include the planning, organization, implementation and evaluation of annual events and programs, such as: wellness and active living; bingo; volunteer recognition; celebration of seniors and holiday concerts.
