4. Animal Control Program Update	<p>a. Trap Neuter and Return (TNR) Pilot Project Update</p> <p>An update on the small group of cats that was trap neutered a returned was provided. Five cats were trapped and are being relocated. The vet charged \$50 for the housing of the five cats. Denielle Duncan submitted the invoice to Christy Lehman for payment, but it was not in the correct format. Christy is speaking to Chris Alexander about to see if an email invoice would be sufficient.</p> <p>b. <u>Barn Cats and Fundraising for the Cat Adoption & Education Centre</u></p> <p>Christy Lehman, Licensing & Standards Coordinator invited the committee to visit the Cat Adoption & Education Centre on Monday, December 22, 2015, at 2:00 pm. The cats will be brought to the centre on January 13, 2015. The grand launch of the centre will be held on February 23, 2015. The OSPCA will be setting the schedule for the adoption centre, noting it will be open at convenient times.</p> <p>c. <u>Fundraising</u></p> <p>The Committee gave copies of a children's book on trap neutering and returning to the Committee.
