
Transit

Yonge Subway

- Finch Ave to Hwy 7 7km
- 6 Stations (Cummer, Steeles, Clark, Royal Orchard, Langstaff and Richmond Hill Centre)
- Currently in Metrolinx 15 Year Implementation Plan -\$2.4 billion (not funded)
- Region of York and TTC conceptual design underway-\$3.75 million
- Awaiting funding commitment/schedule
 from Metrolinx early 2011
- 9 years to implement(design, construction and commissioning)



Transit 407 Transitway



- East of Hwy 400(Spadina Subway) to Kennedy Road (Central segment-Phase 1)
- 23 KM
- Stations at Yonge St, Leslie St, Rodick
 and Markham Centre
- Cost unknown
- In Metrolinx 15 25 year implementation plan
- EA filed December 2010
- Markham Council November 16, 2010 Report



Transit Hwy 7 Rapid Transit



- Yonge Street to Markham Centre
- 7 km dedicated BRT system
- Funding of \$150 million approved by Metrolinx
- Council approved EA on Nov 2006
- Utility relocation currently under way
- Viva- March, 2011 Update



- Calthorpe plan proposed alternative transit hub location

- GO to commence study early 2011



East Markham Mobility Hub



- Funding approval in 2010 Capital Budget to undertake a study for a mobility hub in the Highway 407/Donald Cousens Parkway area
- Stakeholders (MTO, GO Transit ,VIVA and Landowners)
- Next Steps
 - Initiate stakeholders steering group spring 2011
 - Prepare study scope of work and retain consultant
 - Update council as required

Building Markham's Future Together



Metrolinx Study

- Metrolinx Prioritization Study:

The Big Move identified a \$50B transit capital need over the 25- year horizon of the plan and set out three bundles of new transit projects:

- First 15 years, 16 to 25 years and Beyond 25 years

This study is a tool to inform decision- making on unfunded priorities of the Big Move

- Investment Strategy

- Metrolinx strategy as to funding outstanding projects - 2013

- Mobility Hub Guideline (Draft)

To guide planning and development at mobility hubs in GTHA.

Roads

Region of York

- annual (± \$135 million) and 10 year capital program (\$2.1billion)
- Need to be updated based on Growth Management Strategy
- \$400 million in Markham over 10 years
- Key road improvements over next 4 years
 - Highway 7 Woodbine Ave to Sciberras Road
 - Warden Ave 16th Avenue to Major Mackenzie Road
 - 16th Avenue Donald Cousens Parkway to East of Reesor Road (Intersection improvements)
 - Donald Cousens Parkway/Major Mackenzie to Highway 48 2015/16

Sustainable Travel Choices Study to be conducted for the following roads:

- 16th Ave Highway 404 to Kennedy Road
- Bayview Ave Steeles Ave to Highway 407
- Kennedy Road Steeles Ave to Highway 7



• Town of Markham



- Annual and 10 year capital program updates to Council annually - Spring 2011
- ± 35 million per year Capital Program
- Needs to be updated to reflect Growth Management Study and MTSP
- Largely funded by Development Charges
- EA approvals, design and construction could take 3 to 5 years
- Key road improvement over next 4 years:

• Birchmount Road

- Enterprise Blvd to 14th Ave
- Highway 7 to Enterprise Blvd



Roads

• Rodick Road

- Miller Avenue to Esna Park Drive

• Main Street Markham

- 16th Avenue to Major Mackenzie
- Highway 7 to 16th Avenue
- Highway 7 to Highway 407

• Box Grove Collector Road

- Highway 407 to 9th Line

- North of Highway 7

Parking Strategy

Parking – Background

- Markham Transportation Strategic Plan (MTSP) 2002 recommended the establishment of a Parking Authority
- 2005 Markham Centre Parking Strategy prepared
- 2007 Markham Parking Advisory Committee formed

Why a Parking Strategy?

- Address the <u>oversupply of parking</u> created by the current land use policies and development approvals process
- Increase parking turnover in strategic areas across the Town that are currently experiencing parking supply pressures
- Influence transportation demand and mode choice by providing improved travel options and an optimal parking supply





Parking Strategy

- Parking Current Status
 - November 2009 Draft Markham Parking Strategy and Governance presented to Parking Advisory Committee
 - March 2, 2010 Final Draft Markham Parking Strategy, Business Plan and Governance recommendations submitted to Parking Advisory Committee
 - April 2010 Parking Strategy presented to DSC and staff requested to hold a 'Parking Workshop' for members of Council

Next Steps

- Council 'Parking Workshop' strategy, governance options, standards, business plan, on-street parking issues – April 2011
- Present Final Parking Strategy Sept 2011



Transportation Demand Management

Background

- 2002 Markham Transportation Strategic Plan (MTSP) establishes policy framework to implement TDM policies, programs, and services
- Transportation Management Association (TMA) formed in August 2005 Smart Commute Markham /Richmond Hill
- Town commuter options program on-going
 - 50% discount for Town employees on York Region Transit fares
 - Carpool Zone ride matching
 - **G**uaranteed Ride Home program offered
 - Telework pilot program
 - Program review to be carried out in 2011

Next Steps

- TDM and Land Development
 - 'Travel (TDM) Plans' required to support development applications
- Elementary School Travel Plan program framework established
- Community based TDM programs
 - Special events parking management
 - 2010/2011 Residential Pilot Program with Region of York in Cornell
- Smart Commute Markham/Richmond Hill Business Plan Recommendation March 2011



Cycling, Pathways and Trails Master Plans

Background

- **April 2010** Master Plans endorsed by Council
- May 2010 5 Year Implementation Program reviewed and endorsed by Cycling and Pedestrian Committee and Council
- **Nov. 2010** Toogood Pond to Bob Hunter Park MUP review approval
 - Commenced January 2011
- **Dec. 2010** Endorsement of the 5 Year Implementation Program
 - Council requested staff review opportunities to advance implementation

Next Steps

- Environmental Assessment for the Toogood Pond to Bob Hunter Park Multiuse Pedestrian Pathway underway and scheduled to be completed late 2011
- Phasing and funding strategy for 5 year Implementation Program to be prepared – Council Directed - June 2011
- Cycling and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (CPAC) annual business plan to be presented to DSC - March 2011
