<b>1. Call to Order</b>	The Advisory Committee on Accessibility convened at 3:35 p.m. with Sidney Polak presiding as Chair.	
<b>2. Approval of the Minutes</b>	There was a brief discussion on the improvements made to the Civic Centre parking lot.  Moved by Jacqueline Bell Seconded by Councillor Karen Rea  That the May 20, 2015 Advisory Committee on Accessibility Minutes be approved as presented.	CARRIED
<b>3. Update on Accessible Parking</b>	Christopher Alexander, Supervisor of Licensing & Animal Control was in attendance to answer the Committee's questions regarding accessible parking.

	<p><u>Enforcement of Accessible Parking Spots</u></p> <p>The Committee wanted to ensure that there was enough enforcement with respect to the ticketing of vehicles illegally parked in accessible parking spots, especially at malls. In 2014, the City issued approximately 2,100 parking tickets for illegally parking in an accessible parking spot. At Markville Mall the enforcement of the accessible parking spots is undertaken by a private security company managed by the mall. The City could look into providing additional enforcement of the accessible parking spots at the mall.</p> <p>A concern was expressed that disabled persons with an accessible parking permit were being ticketed for parking in an accessible parking spot due to the expiry date on their permit not being visible to the by-law officer. Chris advised that these tickets were being issued in accordance with the City's by-law, which requires the expiry date of the accessible parking permit to be visible at all times when parking in an accessible parking spot. This provision is included in the by-law to ensure that people are not using expired accessible parking permits to park in accessible parking spots. Staff will look into issuing a warning for first time offences of this type. A similar practice is used to enforce overnight parking permits.</p> <p><u>Accessible Parking Spot on Main Street Markham</u></p> <p>The Committee requested that staff look into why an accessible parking spot was placed in front of the Church on Main Street Markham, as it had recommended that the spot be removed from the plans. Cheryl McConney-Wilson will follow up with Sally Campbell on this matter.</p> <p><u>Underground Parking Lot at Civic Centre</u></p> <p>A Committee Member asked if they would be able to park in the underground parking lot at Markham Civic Centre. It was advised this option was explored unsuccessfully in the past. It was not allowed because it is a secure parking spot with a limited number of assigned parking spots</p>	<p>Look into providing a warning for first time offences with respect to the expiry date of the accessible parking permit not being visible – Christopher Alexander</p> <p>Follow up with Sally Campbell regarding why there is an accessible parking spot in front of the Church on Main Street Markham – Cheryl McConney - Wilson</p>

The Committee Clerk was requested to circulate past meeting minutes on this matter to the Committee.</p> <p><u>Accessible Parking Spot in New Developments</u></p> <p>The Committee discussed issues with accessible parking spots in new developments and at medical clinic, like being far from the main entrance or not being wide enough. Another issue mentioned was building owners moving the location of the accessible parking spots several years after the building is built. The Committee wanted to ensure that the City is inspecting accessible parking spots in new development to ensure they are placed in accordance with the Site Plan Agreement for the property.</p> <p>Moved Brendan Faulkner Seconded by Tammy Mok</p> <p>That the Advisory Committee on Accessibility recommend that Council direct staff to inspect if accessible parking spots in new developments, and in developments built after 2005, meet the following criteria:</p> <p>(1) Are in compliance with the <i>Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act</i>, and with <i>Markham's Accessibility Design Guidelines</i>; and,</p> <p>(2) Are located closest to the main entrance of developments.</p>	<p>Place recommendation to Council on General Committee Agenda - Laura</p>

An emphasis was placed on being proactive, especially with respect to following up on the status of action items. New Business</b></p>	<p><u>Board of Trade Nominations</u></p> <p>Staff were extending the deadline for receiving nominations for the Markham Board of Trade Accessibility Award, as only two nominations were received to date. The Committee was encouraged to submit more nominations and to think outside of the box when making nominations. A suggestion was made to re-nominate past businesses that were nominated, but that did not win the award. It was requested that a list of past businesses that were nominated be circulated to the Committee.</p>
