# 1. MINUTES OF THE MARKHAM CYCLING AND PEDESTRIAN ADVISORY COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON APRIL 28, 2011

### 2. TOOGOOD POND TO BOB HUNTER PARK

Peter Miasek provided the Committee with a brief update regarding the May 12, 2011 Community Liason Committee meeting. He advised that a Public Meeting is anticipated to take place in September 2011 and anticipating to begin construction in June 2012.

#### 3. ROUGE PARK TRAILS MASTER PLAN

Michelle Holmes, Rouge Park delivered a PowerPoint presentation providing an update regarding the Rouge Park Tails Master Plan. She advised that there will be a Public Open House on June 14, 2011 at the Toronto Zoo.

The Committee suggested that Ms. Holmes contact Bill Goulding from Sustainable Trails to discuss sustainable alternatives.

# 4. CYCLING FACILITIES DEPUTATION TO YORK REGION TRANSPORTATION SERVICES COMMITTEE

Gord Walter reminded the Committee that he and Peter Miasek will be presenting their deputation on June 15, 2011 at 9:00 AM at the Regional Centre (17250 Yonge Street, Newmarket) and encouraged anyone who is available to attend and support them that it would be greatly appreciated.

There was brief discussion with respect to obtaining input from the urban design department on ways to enhance street separation options.

### 5. 2011 BUSINESS PLAN IMPLEMENTATION

The Committee was advised that Lorenzo Mele has accepted an opportunity with the City of Mississauga and his last day with the Town of Markham is June 3, 2011. Brian Lee, Manager of Development Engineering and Transportation advised that he will provide the Committee with an update at the next meeting regarding a transition plan for Mr. Mele's position.

That the Town of Markham provide staff assistance in the interim.

#### 6. OTHER BUSINESS

### Optimizing Bicycle Facilities in Markham Centre and Physical Separation

Mr. Miasek advised the Committee that he believes Markham Centre would be an ideal opportunity to incorporate the following general principles:

- 2 lane roads and quite 4 lane roads have on-street route with bicycle signs
- Busy 4 lane roads incorporate physical separation, via multi-use path or cycle tracks

There was discussion regarding sections of Birchmount Avenue. Staff advised that they are considering a section of Birchmount Avenue with a raised boulevard to provide a physical distinction.

Whereas the bicycle facilities in Markham Centre are at the design stage;

Therefore be it resolved,

That the Town of Markham Engineering Department consider the Cycling and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (CPAC) principles when reviewing trails and pathways within Markham Centre and report back.
