The Environmental Issues Committee convened at 3:12 p.m. with Deputy Mayor Jack Heath as Chair.

#### 1. **PRESENTATION**

Ms. Claudia Marsales, Manager, Waste Management delivered a PowerPoint presentation briefly outlining the Town of Markham waste management's current program and the results of the 2006 focus group.

The Committee suggested that a visit to the Region's Material Recovery Facilities (MRF) and compost facility would be beneficial.

The Committee discussed the following:

- Incineration process
- The various locations that the waste is currently diverted to
- Backyard composting
- The use of social media to engage residents and possible re-engagement of the focus group from 2006 to obtain their feedback

## 2. COMMUNICATION PLAN

Mr. Dennis Flaherty, Director of Communications and Community Relation delivered a PowerPoint presentation outlining some possible communication programs/tactics to outline Markham's Key messages with respect to York Region's Compostable Bag Program. The Committee suggested that the "Key Messages from Markham" (included in the presentation) be amended as follows:

- #2 The Regional Municipality of York has stated that it requires the use of compostable bags in Green Bins effective May 1, 2011
- #3 The Town of Markham, which is responsible for waste pick-up, will leave its Green Bin container bag requirement and Waste Collection By-law unchanged while the Town reviews the entire waste diversion program over the next five months. During this process there will be opportunities for public input
- #4 Residents may use compostable, biodegradable, plastic, or any other bag of their choice during the review period.

The Committee discussed the following:

- Why is York Region having a mandatory date
- Need to have a justifiable reason to request residents to change to compostable bags
- Possibly holding a press conference or media interview prior to the York Region's mandatory date of May 1, 2011
- Importance of a clear message to the residents

#### 3. FOCUS GROUP

Staff advised that they are recommending that the review of clear and compostable bags include discussions with a focus group.
