BACKGROUND

As part of the Infrastructure Stimulus Fund Project, the Town of Markham (Town) received approval for a 1/3 cost sharing agreement among the Province of Ontario, Government of Canada and the Town to construct a new addition and to renovate the Thornhill Community Centre and Library. Included as part of the scope of work are various furniture requirements for the library.

In an effort to maintain consistency and in accordance with the library's approved furniture standard, library staff pre-selected Steelcase Inc. furniture to ensure consistent standards of durability and functionality.

BACKGROUND

These vehicles are for 2011 seasonal requirements identified by the Operations Parks, Waste Management, Bylaws and Operations Roads departments. These units are required as seasonal fleet units to deliver the required services throughout the spring and summer seasons. The specifications also had an option for vendors to provide pricing on mid size / compact pickup trucks in lieu of full size units. The pricing for these smaller units came in at a slightly higher cost per month \$760.66 versus \$755.57 inclusive of HST impact. Based on current data in the 2010 Fuel Consumption Guide the fuel consumption for the mid size is also higher 14.4 L/100 km v 14.1 L/100 km for city driving for the ½ ton regular cab. The full size units with the 8 foot box are also much better suited to the user department requirements.

E3 Project

In 2010, an E3 project was proposed that would look into options to purchase used vehicles as summer rentals and dispose of them at a later date. The initiative identified opportunities to recover most of the capital purchase fee to reduce the net cost of ownership, which was projected to be less than the cost of short term summer vehicle rentals. The analysis of this project also dealt with costs for repair and upkeep and right sizing of vehicles. In 2010, Fleet staff determined that the used truck market could not support the short term purchase and sale of trucks due to the downturn in the auto industry, which resulted in a shortage of crew cabs and pick-up trucks at vehicle wholesale auctions.

However, Staff is proposing the commencement of the E3 pilot project by eliminating a requirement for two (2) rental ½ ton regular cab pick-ups from the above noted award and instead procuring two (2) used vehicles as summer rentals and dispose of them later in 2011. The purchase of these two (2) used vehicles will be awarded under a separate staff award report.

Note: The contractual term under tender 289-T-10 has a renewal option of two (2) additional years at the same price and conditions. However, staff will evaluate the success of the E3 pilot project noted above prior to seeking approval authority to extend beyond the 2011 term.

BACKGROUND

The Villages of Fairtree Community Park, which includes the Town's first public cricket facility, is located northeast of Markham Rd. and Steeles Ave. The architectural consultant will design and provide construction administration services for a park washroom building and pavilion. Selected sub-consultants required for this project, such as mechanical, electrical, structural and civil are included in the base fee as well as allowances for surveying and other sub-consultants.

This facility shall include a public washroom, storage and mechanical room of about 700 square feet and an outdoor patio with shade structure of about 1500 square feet. The washroom building will be serviced with electrical, water, storm and sanitary sewer connections and will be designed for seasonal use. It is anticipated that the construction of this project will begin in September 2011 and be finished by June 2012.
