1. NO PAID PARKING IN UNIONVILLE

- a. Partial victory after attending many meetings. Good support from Councillor Hamilton.
- b. Unionville's name removed from final report on Town wide Paid Parking Plan.
- c. Markham Main Street removed as well.
- 2. FLOWERS ON MAIN
 - a. Have requested a count of the flowers on Main Street as we are not aware of any more planned reductions
 - b. Noticed missing barrels and baskets from many poles and standards
