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Brief Background

- Introduced in 70's bottled water industry began to boom in the early 1980s
- In 1999 28.4 litres of water per person
- In 2006 66 litres of water per person
- In 2006, 3 in 10 Canadians used bottled water as a main source of drinking water
- By 2008, bottled water sales in Canada were \$1.6 billion

Others Actions

In Canada:

- 71 municipalities "banned" bottled water
- 35 universities/colleges now have bottled water-free zones
- 2 universities "banned" it
- 6 school boards now have restrictions
- Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) passed a resolution

- Many benefits of tap water and for bottled water in some cases as well
- Markham has 90 facility buildings some w/o water service and was involved in about 200 community events in 2009
- Some events +50,000 people
- Prior to corporate bottled water restrictions -Staff is recommending a comprehensive corporate audit of its use




































Policy and Actions

- Determine how and why we use bottle water
- Determine barriers to drinking tap water
- Basis for the policy and awareness outreach
- Establish a benchmark for future comparisons

Recommendations

- 1. Comprehensive audit of corporate bottled water use (assessments at C.C.'s, Markham Theatre, Other municipal buildings and Town events)
- 2. Report back with findings, Draft Corporate Policy and actions to restrict bottled water use
