he Thérèse Casgrain
Volunteer Award, a
Government of Canada
initiative, was originally established
in 1982, and re-launched in 2001,
International Year of Volunteers.
This award commemorates the work
of Thérèse Casgrain and honours
those who have demonstrated a
strong commitment to volunteering.

Thérèse Casgrain was an eminent Canadian whose actions continue to serve as an example to all. She was the force behind various social reforms promoting justice and equality. Thérèse Casgrain was appointed to the Senate in 1970, and became a Companion of the Order of Canada in 1974. Throughout her life she chose to defend the cause of disadvantaged members of society, to denounce social injustice and to lend a voice to those who had none. Thérèse Casgrain was an inspiring Canadian in every sense of the word.

THE THÉRÈSE CASGRAIN VOLUNTEER AWARD

The Thérèse Casgrain Volunteer Award is presented annually to two exceptional volunteers. It recognizes volunteers from communities across Canada. Award recipients are individuals whose social commitment and persistent efforts have contributed significantly to the well-being of their fellow Canadians.

AWARD CATEGORIES:

One Youth Participation award

(from the age of 18 to 30)

One Lifelong Commitment award

(from the age of 31 and over)

Each award consists of a bronze medallion bearing the likeness of Thérèse Casgrain; a lapel pin; a certificate of recognition; and \$5000 to be awarded to a registered Canadian charity designated by the recipients. Recipients are honoured at an award dinner and ceremony in Ottawa planned to coincide with International Volunteer Day (December 5).

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- Candidates must be Canadian citizens, permanent residents or protected persons within the meaning of the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act.
- Nominations of candidates should demonstrate that:
 - the spirit of volunteerism has become an important part of candidates' lives:
 - their volunteer efforts have improved the overall quality of life of their fellow Canadians;
 - they have demonstrated leadership, creativity, cooperation and hard work;
 - they have developed or supported an activity that enables Canadians to participate in their communities; and,
 - they have created effective partnerships with the private and not-forprofit sectors, local communities and/or governments.

Members of the Thérèse F. Casgrain Foundation, elected officials of government (municipal, provincial and federal) while serving in office, past recipients of the award, members of the National Selection Committee and employees of Human Resources and Skills Development Canada are not eligible to receive the award.

Candidates will not be considered posthumously.

NOMINATION SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Nominations for the Thérèse Casgrain Volunteer Award may be submitted by an organization or three individuals who are not related to the candidate.

Nominations must be postmarked by June 19, 2009. Late entries will be put towards the following year's award.

THE NOMINATION PACKAGE

The nomination package must be submitted on 8.5" x 11" sheets, typed, reproduced or clearly written in dark ink. It must include: the completed nomination

and consent form (with signatures), the completed nomination template, three letters of support, and a resume/statement (as applicable) of the candidate's work.

Nominations must be submitted in their entirety and must not exceed 20 pages. Additional enclosures such as cassettes, videotapes, diskettes, CDs and media clippings will not be reviewed.

THE SELECTION PROCESS

Nominations are evaluated solely on the contents of the nomination template and supporting documents.

Government officials review all nominations and short-list the top candidates in each award category.

The short-listed nominations are evaluated by the National Selection Committee. The Committee is made up of members from the not-for-profit sector, members of the Thérèse F. Casgrain Foundation, past award recipients and government officials. Based on the recommendations of the National Selection Committee, the Minister of Human Resources and Skills Development selects the award recipients.

Candidates whose nominations have been short-listed receive a certificate of appreciation.
