RECOMMENDATION:

PURPOSE:

To inform Council of Staff Awarded Contracts >\$50,000 for the month of February 2015 as per Purchasing By-law 2004-341.

BACKGROUND:

Council at its meeting of May 26th, 2009 amended By-Law 2004-341, <u>A By-Law Establishing Procurement, Service and Disposal Regulations and Policies.</u> The Purchasing By-Law delegates authority to staff to award contracts without limits if the award meets the following criteria:

- The award is to the lowest priced bidder
- The expenses relating to the goods / services being procured is included in the approved budget (Operating/Capital)
- The award of the contract is within the approved budget
- The award results from the normal tendering process of the City (i.e. open bidding through advertisements that meet transparency and enables open participation)
- The award is to the lowest priced bidder
- The term of the contract is for a maximum of 4 years
- There is no litigation between the successful bidder and the City at the time of award
- There are no bidder protests at the time of contract award

If one (1) of the above noted criteria is not met then any contract award >\$350,000 requires Council approval.

Where the contract being awarded is a Request for Proposal (RFP) the approval authority limits of staff is up to \$350,000.

BACKGROUND

Waterworks utilizes contracted services to perform routine flushing and cleaning of sanitary sewers as part of a preventative maintenance program in the sanitary sewer system. The purpose is to achieve a service level for flushing and cleaning all sanitary sewers once every 5 years. This requires flushing and cleaning of approximately 130-150 kilometers of sewer per year. The contractor is also available to assist waterworks staff in clearing blockages in the sanitary sewer system on an emergency basis, and also for the removal and haulage of sanitary sewage on an emergency basis. The use of contractors for this routine work permits City staff to focus on corrective maintenance in the system and customer service.

OPTIONS/DISCUSSIONS

In 2014, staff awarded Tender 299-T-13 to the lowest priced supplier D. M. Robichaud Associates Limited ("D. M. Robichaud") for a one (1) year term, however, the Tender had an option to renew for two (2) additional years at the same terms, conditions, pricing and subject to contractor's performance and satisfaction of the City. Staff only obtained approval in 2014 for a one (1) year award as pricing was higher compared to the previous contract (2010-2013) due to increased operating costs (e.g. labour and fuel costs). The second lowest supplier in 2014 was 5% higher in cost to D. M. Robichaud (before the negotiations below).

Subsequently, in lieu of going back to the market due to their positive performance in 2014, Staff negotiated with D. M. Robichaud. With the negotiated 19% reduction in unit prices, Staff now recommends extending the contract for the final two (2) years (2015 & 2016) as per the original contract.

As a result of the higher unit price in 2014, 40 kilometers of sewer pipes were deferred. It is the intention that flushing will be carried out on these sewer pipes in 2015 as part of the annual 150 kilometers of flushing. Lower priority will be given to sewer pipes requiring less work and flushing will be carried out on these as part of the 2016 program.

^{**} Staff are able to do the allotted work (150 kilometers) in 2015 without any additional funding as the shortfall will be funded from another operating account 760-511-5300 (contracted Services), which reported a favourable variance of \$16,834 at the end of 2014. This account has an annual budget of \$114,600 and will be reduced to offset the increase in this award and the budget will be adjusted accordingly.

BACKGROUND

Carlton Road Sewage Pumping Station (CR-SPS) is located at the southwest bank of Toogood Pond and east of #216 on Carlton Road in Unionville. CR-SPS was built in 1976 with a standby diesel engine/power generator set and related control equipment in an unheated enclosure located within a 5m x 7m fenced off area.

Parts for the existing engine/power generator set are not readily available. It has become very difficult and expensive to maintain the existing unit. Furthermore, the existing power/generator set is near the end of its service life and has become unreliable with frequent breakdowns and needs to be replaced with a new set. Upgrade is required to the existing control/electrical system to bring the facility to meet the current City Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) Standards.

In April 2013, Moon Matz Ltd. was retained for the design, tender document preparation, contract administration, site inspection and project management for the replacement of the engine/power generator set and electrical/control equipment at CR-SPS. A capital budget (Project 14302 - Carlton Road Pumping Station Upgrade) was approved in the amount of \$506,500 (including 10% contingency and HST impact) for the project construction. The estimated construction cost provided by Moon Matz Ltd. was \$566,955.84 (incl. 10% contingency and HST impact). Request for Tender (RFT 075-T-14) for CR-SPS Upgrade was released on April 23, 2014 and closed on May 15, 2014. Bid prices received from four (4) bidders ranged from \$799,327.85 to \$964,428.36 (including HST impact). The lowest bid resulted in a difference (shortfall, including 10% contingency and HST impact) of \$372,760.64 from the capital budget.

Staff assessed acceptability of the bid price and recommended to:

- Cancel RFT 075-T-14 as the lowest tendered price more than exceeded the initial budget.
- Obtain approval for a revised funding requirement as part of the 2015 budget; and
- Re-tender the project in Q4 2014 subject to 2015 budget approval with some project scope changes to reduce overall project cost by identifying equipment and/or appurtenances could be eliminated or changed with minimal impact to operations
- Request for Tender (RFT 253-T-14) for CR-SPS Upgrade with some scope changes was released on December 2, 2014 and closed on December 18, 2014. The city is able to attain a reduction of \$65,983 compared to previous tender.

Staff further recommends:

THAT the tendering process be waived in accordance with Purchasing By-Law 2004-341, Part II, Section 7 Non Competitive Procurement, item 1 (g) which states "Where it is in the City's best interest not to solicit a competitive bid."

BACKGROUND

As part of the Civic Centre Site Safety and Accessibility Improvements project, the existing driveway and parking lot lights need to be replaced per requirement of lifecycle and to enhance public safety. In order to improve the lighting levels, the existing HPS luminaires need to be replaced with new poles and dark sky compliant LED luminaires.

The following two products are recommended by the staff based on their photometric performance which meets City's design standards. These luminaires are bird friendly and dark sky complaint.

- (1) Driveway area (40 poles and 40 LED Luminaires) recommended Phillips product called Metroscape.
 - (a) NOTE: Aluminous Lighting Products is the distributor for this product.
- (2) Parking lot area (12 Poles + 19 LED luminaires +59 photo controls) recommended Acuity product called Lithonia.
 - (b) NOTE: Independent Electric Supply is the distributor for this product.

DISCUSSION

The delivery period for the poles and LED fixtures is approximately 8-10 weeks, therefore staff recommends that the poles and LED luminaires to be ordered directly in order to meet the completion date of June 1, 2015. The supply of lighting equipment is on the critical path in completing this project in time for the lead up to the 2015 Pan Am Games. The project is required to be completed by June 1, 2015 before the Pan Am Torch Relay.

The luminaires match the recently installed streetlighting along Town Centre Blvd, hence only a single source of supply is available for the bulk of this equipment.

Staff negotiated with the manufacturers/ distributors and the final prices are reasonable.

Also, the provisional items include mobilization and demobilization, excavation and disposal of contaminated material, geotechnical testing, tree removal, replacement of culverts below the pedestrian pathway and costs associated with larger submersible trash pumps i.e. 4 and 6 inch.

BACKGROUND

The Pomona Mills Creek is showing many signs of degradation. There are a number of erosion and bank failure sections in the creek which are threatening the integrity of existing pedestrian trails.

A Class EA Study for the Pomona Mills Creek Erosion Restoration was completed in 2011. The recommendations of the study are focused on improving the environmental conditions and restoring sections of the Creek.

On April 2011, Council endorsed the recommendations of the Class EA Study for the Pomona Mills Erosion Restoration and directed staff to implement the preferred restoration option in five (5) phases over 5-10 years.

The construction of phases 1, 2, 3 & 4 are now complete.

Phase 1 - Restoration of 2 erosion sites (construction completed in 2009).

- Site 1 located between Thornheights Rd. and Kirk Dr.
- Site 2 located near Henderson Ave. immediately south of the Toronto Ladies' Golf Course.

Phase 2 - Restoration of Pomona Mills Creek near Thorny Brae Drive (construction completed in 2012).

Phase 3 & 4 - Restoration of Pomona Mills at the north and south sides of Royal Orchard Boulevard (construction completed in 2014).

This award is for the construction of the erosion restoration along Pomona Mills Creek at Royal Orchard Park as shown in the attached key plan (Attachment A). The section of creek at this location has recently shown severe bank erosion and unstable slope which is threatening the stability of the adjacent pathway.

^{**} The remaining funding will be used for other erosion restoration projects as budgeted for within this account.

BACKGROUND (Continued)

The scope of work for this project in consultation with the Operations Department involves the following;

- 1. Installation of an armourstone retaining wall.
- 2. Installing concrete encasement protection for existing sanitary sewer.
- 3. Site excavation and grading including removal of excess material.
- 4. Installation of a riverstone trench for toe protection.
- 5. Installation of rip rap on restored creek bank.
- 6. Installation of live stakes, potted plant material and trees.
- 7. Site restoration including sod adjacent to existing pathways.

The project is expected to be completed by fall 2015.
