Enhancing Community Involvement and Visitor Experience



- First time the RCGA has enjoyed full community involvement in the Open

Operations

- Active participants in the Tournament's Transportation & Parking Committee
- Provide maps and air photos of site and surrounding areas
- Work with Committee to develop Road Network Plan
 - Road closures, detours, signs and notifications, barricades and pylons
 - Will allow residents and commuters to better plan their routes and avoid congestion areas
 - Directional and event signage to help visitors find the various Markham tourist attractions
- Community Relations and Site Control
 - Engage Angus Glen residents
 - Work with By-Laws to Implement parking permit system (residents can distribute parking permits to their guests in advance of the tournaments)
 - Work with By-Laws and monitor illegal event on-street parking (operations staff at each street entrances to the subdivision to check street parking permits)
 - Operations staff will monitor traffic management and parking



Waste Management and Building Standards

Waste Management:

 Train volunteers to ensure a proper recycling system is in place further promoting Markham's commitment to waste diversion and the environment

Building Standards:

- Work with organizers to clarify permit applications, requirements, fees and time frames for approval
- Ensure approvals for temporary buildings including tents and bleachers
- In so doing, provide assurance to the public that permitted structures are safe





Fire and Emergency Services

- Preplanning
 - Meet and work with organizers
 - Look at cooking facilities and all outdoor flame to ensure conformance with Ontario Fire Code
 - Prevent overcrowding of areas
 - Map out fire department access and provide input into determination of road closures
- Inspection
- Sparky, smart car will be on hand
- Monitoring for fire safety during event to ensure a safe and pleasurable experience for all



Economic Development



- Become a Corporate Hospitality Sponsor and implement a business networking event and luncheon at the Open similar to 2002 efforts
 - Saturday, July 28, 2007 during the Open
 - Showcase community leadership and market Markham as the best place to do business
 - Highlight strategic projects and build awareness of Markham as the High-Tech Capital
 - Agenda designed to market Markham as a leader in Technology and innovation
 - Investigating Keynote speaker
 - Economic Development and Senior Staff will invite business leaders and strategic partners
 - Town of Markham receives recognition and signage
 - 70 event parking passes, an invitation to the hospitality orientation luncheon and 144 marquee tent passes (includes tickets to the 3rd round of the Open)


