Animal Control Program Update	<u>Review of Action Items</u> The Committee reviewed the action items from the last meeting. <u>Feral Cat Day</u> There was a discussion on: (1) the possibility of having a press conference in November announcing the City's TNR project and promoting Feral Cat Day; and (2) providing a TNR workshop in February. <u>OSPCA Statistics</u> Christopher Alexander provided the following Animal Control Program Update: The method used to calculate the OSPCA statistics was explained. TNR	<p>Chris Alexander will work with the OSPCA, IBM and the Committee to try and schedule a trapping session on the IBM site the last weekend of October/first weekend of November.</p>	Try to schedule trapping session on OSPCA site last weekend of October/first weekend of November – Christopher Alexander
Wildlife	<p>The euthanasia rate for wildlife was down from 59% in 2013, to 26% in first seven months of 2014. This stat was anticipated to improve even more when the Toronto Wildlife Centre moves to the Rouge Park area.</p>	Look into having press release on improvement to wildlife services – Christopher Alexander
	<p>The Committee suggested that the City's Communication Department issue a press on the improvement to the City's wildlife services.</p>	
Store Front	<p>The Thornhill Community Centre, Senior's Centre, Library Staff, and Manager were all consulted on the vision for the storefront and on the possibility of it being located at the Community Centre. The feedback to date has been positive. The next step will be to bring a report forward to Council after the election. The storefront could be open as early as June 2015, depending on the Council direction provided to staff in January, 2015.</p>
