


About Seneca College

- AChannel outlet located in Markham Campus, summer 2005




Meeting the Growing Demand of a Growing Community

- Rapid growth in Markham requires continued investment in services and infrastructure
- This includes educational
 opportunities especially in business
 and information technology
- The Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities measures show a shortage of over 2,700 student spaces in post-secondary education in Markham and York Region
- Seneca will meet this need



The Future in Markham

- Markham is one of the fastest growing and diverse communities in Canada and the largest municipality in York Region
- According to *York Region Facts*, there are over 25,000 businesses employing over 400,000 people with over 20,000 jobs being added annually
- Markham specifically has become an important centre of Canada's high tech economy and home to over 800 technology employers

- The Office of Resource Development aims to secure \$10 million in private sector support from individuals, corporate and foundation donors and the broader Markham community
- Revenue for the Markham Campus will support student financial aid, capital maintenance, infrastructure, and information technology.

Accomplishments to Date

- Parmalat Canada made the first gift to the Appeal with a pledge of support of \$50,000 to an endowed bursary – once matched by OSOTF it will be a endowed fund of \$100,000
- Avaya Canada is in the process of completing an in-kind contribution to the Markham Call Centre with a total estimated value of \$200,000
- Over the next 2 months, Cabinet Volunteers have identified and are approaching the top 20 donor prospects capable of significant lead contributions

About Municipal Support for College Capital Appeals Examples:

- The Town of Oakville supporting Sheridan College: \$2 million over 5 years in support of infrastructure and Digital Media
- The City of Barrie supporting Georgian College: \$2 million over 5 years in support of SuperBuild Project
- The **City of Orillia** supporting Georgian College: \$250,000 over 5 years
- The County of Simcoe supporting Georgian College: \$600,000 one time payment
