Markham's Public Art Program

- Initiated a Public Art Program in 2003
- In May 2012 Council approved a Public Art Policy to direct the integration of public art into public places
- In December 2012 Markham approved a Culture Plan identifying public art as a key contributor to the uniqueness and identity of the City of Markham
- The Public Art 3 Year Plan will be brought forward to Council in Q1, 2015



Markham's Public Art Program

Objectives of the inclusion of Public Art into the Markham's Public Realm are as follows:

- To create a sense of cohesiveness to Markham's diverse identities,
- To connect distinctive city centres and neighbourhoods within the larger context of Markham,
- To make creative public spaces to enhance the visual quality of Markham and engage residents and visitors,
- To emphasize Markham's distinctiveness through an accessible and high quality public art collection.






