


Future Expansion of Markham's Urban Area



Basis for a New Official Plan

What policy requirements will be addressed through the new Official Plan?

- Conform with provincial legislation, Plans
- ✓ Conform with Region of York Official Plan
- ✓ Incorporate Council's endorsed growth alternative to 2031
- Address Markham's preferences in community planning
- Rationalize existing Secondary Plans
- Establish a policy context for updating Markham zoning by-laws

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Build Sustainable Communities

- Align intensification and transportation services
- Increase housing choices
- Sustainable design, development, infrastructure
- Compatible form and function of development
- Appropriate mixing of land uses
- Integrate natural and cultural heritage
- Increase live-work opportunities
- Healthy economy



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Protect the Natural Environment and Agricultural Lands



- Implement senior government Plans Greenbelt Plan,
 Oak Ridges Moraine, ROP (Greenlands System)
- Integrate watershed planning
- Reserve lands for continued farming and accommodate agricultural activity
- Facilitate options for urban agriculture





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Increase Travel Choices



- Increase travel choices support patterns of growth and land use that reduce travel requirements and encourage travel by transit, cycling and walking
- Optimize use of transportation system to increase efficiency of moving people and goods
- Reduce environmental impacts of transportation
- Promote liveable, active and healthy communities

Policy Directions

- Integrate land use and transportation planning
- Influence travel behaviour via policies, education and services
- Pursue transit culture priority for transit, active travel modes
- Review strategic improvements to road network
- Manage parking supply
- Facilitate goods movement
- Improve road safety
- Phase development to transit delivery
- Support sustained transit funding







Employment and the Economy

- Retain existing business and accommodate new employment
 - Protect existing business park lands
 - Add new business park lands
 - Promote intensification
- Attract business activity in key sectors
- Focus office development on rapid transit
- Support integration of retail development in preferred locations and forms
- Support "Main Street" revitalization and development



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Strategic Objective - Leadership and innovation





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
Strategic Objective – Develop sustainable, compact, complete communities

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Strategic Objective – Effectively move people and goods







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Strategic Objective – Maintain a prosperous and competitive economy



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
Strategic Objective – Sustain a local food system


