Hello Mr. Scarpitti and Ms. Moretti: I am a Markham resident with a child who has been diagnosed with a rare auto-immune disorder, CNS Vasculitis and I am trying to increase medical professional, public and government awareness of the existence of this rare disorder and of vasculidites in general. Heather is 10 years old and was diagnosed at age 7. Although considered extremely rare, at the time of diagnosis I was told by my local hospital that I would probably not meet another patient with CNS vasculitis. I have since met several (one child in Markham, another in Aurora) and many more through the internet in various parts of Canada and the US. It appears that auto-immune disorders are the disease of this generation and I believe the public needs to be informed of its existence to allow increased awareness of these difficult to diagnose disorders, as they are frequently misdiagnosed as more common diseases such as meningitis due to lack of awareness of existence of CNS Vasculitis. The American Vasculitis Foundation and its sister Vasculitis Foundation of Canada has declared May 3 to 9 as Vasculitis Awareness Week and members have been contacting their representatives to have corresponding states and or cities to declare the same. I am forwarding a copy of the Wisconsin legislature resolution to use as a template - I put in blue ink wording to replace some of the American terms. I highlighted in yellow areas I was not sure of wording or names of people involved but felt your staff could rework to make the document relevant to Markham. I would appreciate your support to make this happen in my residential area - if possible I would like suggestions to have this pass at the Provincial and Federal level also. 2009 ASSEMBLY JOINT RESOLUTION 44

April 17, 2009 – Introduced by Representatives HUBLER, ZIEGELBAUER, MOLEPSKE JR., PASCH, SOLETSKI, BIES, SINICKI, POPE–ROBERTS, JORGENSEN and TOWNSEND, cosponsored by Senators LEHMAN, TAYLOR and PLALE. Referred to Committee on Rules.

Relating to: declaring May 3 to May 9, 2009, to be Vasculitis Awareness Week. Whereas, vasculitis is an inflammation of the blood vessels, also called angiitis, that causes changes in the walls of blood vessels, including thickening, weakening, narrowing, and scarring and the inflammation from these changes can be acute or chronic and can be so severe that the tissues and organs supplied by the affected vessels do not receive enough blood, which can result in organ and tissue damage and even death; and

Whereas, many types of vasculitis exist and, although rare, vasculitis can affect anyone; some age groups are affected more than others, depending on the type of vasculitis; and while some forms of vasculitis improve on their own, others require treatment to the extent that 100 000 Americans (Lam trying to get # in Canada), are hospital

treatment to the extent that 100,000 Americans (I am trying to get # in Canada) are hospitalized for vasculitis care each year; and

Whereas, diseases resulting from vasculitis include Wegener's

Granulomatosis, Behcet's disease, Buerger's disease, Central Nervous System Vasculitis, Churg Strauss syndrome, Cryglobulinemia, Giant Cell

Arterititis, Henoch-Schonlein purpura, Hypersensitivity vasculitis, Kawasaki disease, Microscopic Polyangiitis, Polyarteritis nodosa,

Polymyalgia rheumatica, Rheumatoid Vasculitis, and Takayasu's arteritis and

Whereas, the Vasculitis Foundation Canada, and research centres such as the Central Nervous System (CNS)

Vasculitis Clinic and Program at SickKids and the Vasculitis Clinic at University of Toronto at Mount Sinai Hospital, and the St. Joseph's Hospital in Hamilton, Ontario with the help of grass roots support, works to support positive change in the lives of people who live with vasculitis and the foundation's members work to educate Congress medical professionals, the public and governing bodies about vasculitis and the need to support research funding so that science can better understand the disease and identify advanced treatments and one day find a cure; now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the assembly, the senate concurring, That the members of the Wisconsin legislature commend the efforts of the Vasculitis Foundation to make legislators and the public aware of vasculitis and the need for continued study of the ailment and declare the week of May 3 to May 9, 2009, to be Vasculitis Awareness

Be it further resolved, That the assembly chief clerk shall provide copies of this joint resolution to the Vasculitis Foundation Canada and to Margaret Loftus of Markham Ontario; Dr. Susa Benseler of SickKids, Toronto; Dr. Simon Carette, Mount Sinai, Toronto; Dr. Nader Khalidi, St. Joseph's Hospital, Hamilton (END)
