Posters advertising Character Community Week are included in this package. Please post them in prominent locations.
























The Recycling Council of Ontario (RCO) requests that your municiaplity declare October 16-22, 2006 as Waste Reduction Week (WRW) in your community.

During 2005, we were able to raise the lupus flag in Toronto, Ottawa, Kincardine, Kapuskasing, Fort Erie, Welland, Niagara Falls, Port Colborne and Guelph, to name just a few of the communities. We would like to continue with this programme, to bring awareness to everyone in Ontario, but we need the approval of Mayors and Councils to bring our quest into a reality.

Would your City Hall be willing to raise our flag during the month of October? We will furnish the flag, a return postage-paid envelope and literature for your libraries and hospitals. We would ask that a photograph be taken of the flag raising with your Mayor or a representative to publish in our quarterly newsletter, "Lupus Talk". We do have a volunteer who is able to raise the flag with you.

Our website hits have escalated from 4300 to 120,348 in two years. These hits were reported in March, 2006. We know that many individuals living in Ontario are still unaware of what lupus is, or even that there is a chronic disease called lupus.

With your help, we will be able to educate many and help them to obtain a proper diagnosis along with suggestions how to manage and cope with lupus.

We look forward to raising our flag in Markham and hope that you will be able to accommodate our request.
