With visionary support from people like you and others leaders, we hope to fight this illness which affect 1 in 10 families and harms our community in many ways. 



WHO WE ARE....

The Prevention of Elder Abuse Committee of York Region is a collaboration of healthcare and social service providers in York Region that was formed in 1990. Over the past 16 years, members of the Committee have become knowledgeable and a valuable resource in the community to respond to elder abuse.

The Committee is seen as the leaders in York Region, whose members can be contacted by other agencies for support and it also helps facilitate linkages between agencies in responding to abuse and other related issues. There is no other committee that encompasses agencies from both health and social service of this kind in the community of York Region who meets regularly to specifically address issues related to the prevention of elder abuse or develops programs/tools to assist vulnerable seniors and families. We hope that seniors will also join this committee and become active in these activities.

The Prevention of Elder Abuse Committee of York Region is an independent committee with the GOAL of facilitating the planning and coordination of educational activities related to elder abuse prevention in York Region and brings awareness of elder abuse issues to all segments of the York Region community. The Committee is dedicated to the awareness and promotion of prevention of elder abuse in York Region and acts as a resource on elder abuse to the community'

This committee has accomplished significant projects since it started including:

- Development of an Elder Abuse Awareness Manual (1993),
- Protocol on The Identification and Detection of Elder Abuse (IDEA)
- Participated in hosting a Community Connecting Modules workshop (Feb 03)
- Received Community Crime Prevention Grant (\$11,900):
 - o Purchased a display board (multi-lingual)
 - o Produced 20,000 brochures which were translated into four (4) languages English, French, Chinese and Italian (2002)
- Launched Pamphlet (2003)
- Rotation of the Elder Abuse Display board at Senior Centres, LTC homes, etc expansion of visibility in York region to heighten profile of issue (2004 on-going)
- Participated in the Best Practices Resource Guide Focus Group (2004)
- Participated in a joint meeting with other central east elder abuse networks to discuss protocol development and share ideas of the Committee's work (2005)
- Ongoing collaboration with community agencies and organizations, police, and seniors
- Provision of "Free" education initiatives on topics relevant for seniors and health providers who are working with the seniors in the region (on-going)
 - o Community education session at McConaghy Centre 1998
 - o Northern York region with school children 1999
 - o Two education sessions with religious leaders 1999

- o Education to seniors group Stouffville 2005
- Organized Public Guardian and Trustee Presentation-full attendance! (2005)
- Grant Application sent to New Horizons and accepted for promoting awareness in the senior population.
- Incorporated educational days into core Committee meetings to update members on services for older adults in York Region (on-going)

The effort and accomplishment achieved by this Committee have improved the coordination of services in York Region which has had a positive impact for seniors themselves, their families and caregivers seeking assistance.
