Servicing Allocation Update

Development Services Commission

Background

- Markham Council on February 22, 2005 assigned servicing allocation based on flow control option (Attachment 'A')
- > Allocation was subject to Regional approval

Region advised on March 31, 2005 that in addition to the YDSS sanitary capacity constraint, capacity in the Duffin Creek Sewage Treatment Plant was limited

Background continued

- York Region has been negotiating with Durham Region to obtain additional capacity in the treatment plant
- Residential site plan/draft plan approvals continue to be held, pending confirmation of servicing allocation from the Region.
- Recently some applications have been approved from Town reserves (Liberty, Box Grove)

Status of Servicing Allocation

Regional June 15, 2005 report (Attachment 'B') recommends distribution of additional servicing allocation

Highlights of the Regional report are;

- Markham is receiving allocation of 6,000 residential units
- Region is maintaining a reserve of 6000 population (1765 units)
- Region has attempted to provide a 5 year supply to all municipalities (Region of York Attachment '2')
- The allocation is subject to conditions assigned to each municipality pertaining to Regional sewer and water infrastructure delivery (Region of York Attachment '1'/Table 4)
- Markham's condition is the provision of the flow control option endorsed by Markham Council in February 2005 (to be operational late 2005)

Status of Servicing Allocation Continued

Prior to release of allocation the Region requires confirmation of;

- Passing of By-law to prohibit building permits if servicing allocation is not available
- Adoption of allocation including "use it or lose it"
- Infrastructure construction as listed in table 4
- Monitoring program for residential planning approvals and building permits
- v. Establish Strategic Priorities
- vi. Phasing Plan for Secondary Plans
- vii. Clear and transparent criteria for allocation
- viii. Overall Municipal wide Phasing Plans



Status

To discuss with Region

Staff Comments

Concerns regarding:

- Regions growth rate analysis for Markham does not reflect 5 year average (3241 vs. 3500)
- Market distortions ("use it or lose it")
- Relationship of planning approvals / projected growth rate / building permit activity
- Severances (3 new lots or less)

Markham will need additional allocation before 2011 and staff will work with the Region to achieve additional allocation through:

- Monitoring actual growth demand across the Region
- Examining p.p.u. calculations
- Re-rating of treatment plant
- Units from Regional reserve (to support centres and corridors)

Staff Comments Continued

With the Region's proposed allocation, rescinding unused allocation and new servicing policies related to hamlets, Markham reserve could increase from 597 units to ± 2100 units

Region should fast track the EA, design and construction of the YDSS and Duffin Creek improvements to advance schedule from its current December 2010 target

Approval of Regional June 15, 2005 report is critical so Markham can approve residential applications effective June 21, 2005 (over 1200 units)

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Next Steps

Markham proceed to draft plan/site plan approve those residential developments assigned allocation from February 15, 2005.

Staff report back (August/September 2005) with recommendations as to the distribution of reserves and related policies to allow planning approvals to continue.

Recommendations

- That the distribution of servicing allocation as per the Region of York June 15, 2005 report be endorsed;
- And that the Region of York be requested to work with area municipalities and UDI to review further allocation opportunities including future distribution of reserves, allocation from the re-rating of the Duffin Creek Plant, etc.;
- And that the Region be requested to finalize, in consultation with area municipalities, policies related to servicing allocation;
- And that the Region be requested to fast track the EA, design and construction of the Southeast collector and the Duffin Creek treatment plant.
- And that Markham again begin to approve severances of 3 new lots, or less
