Re: Bill C-322 An Act to amend the <u>Health of Animals Act</u> and the <u>Meat Inspection Act</u> (Slaughter of Horses for Human Consumption)

The City of Markham Council has recently been made aware of a Private Member's Bill C-322 an Act to amend the <u>Health of Animals Act</u> and the <u>Meat Inspection Act</u> (Slaughter of Horses for Human Consumption). The Bill was first introduced into the House of Commons on October 10, 2011, and received First Reading. It has now been re-instated into the second session of the current Parliament. The Bill proposes to amend the <u>Health for Animals Act</u> and the <u>Meat</u> <u>Inspection Act</u> to prohibit the importation and exportation of horse meat for human consumption into or out of Canada as well as between provinces.

The Bill was introduced in response to three concerns: 1) the possible contamination of horse meat for human consumption from the unregulated administration of drugs; 2) the manner in which horses are transported for slaughter; and 3) the method by which horses are slaughtered.

Markham City Council encourages the Canadian Food Inspection Agency to address the concerns raised in Bill C-322 and to take all necessary steps to ensure the animals entering the Canadian food supply are free of contaminants (and has passed a resolution to this effect dated November 12, 2013). The City also encourages the Agency to ensure that all animals involved are treated humanely throughout the slaughtering process.
