SUBJECT: Mary Elizabeth Crescent Proposed Parking Prohibition

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

1) That the staff report entitled "Mary Elizabeth Crescent Proposed Parking Prohibition", be received;

- 2) And that Schedule "C" of Parking By-law 2005-188, be amended by prohibiting parking at any time, on the west side of Mary Elizabeth Crescent, between Morrison Crescent and the property line of #20/22 Mary Elizabeth Crescent;
- 3) And that the Operations Department be directed to install and maintain the appropriate regulatory signs at the subject locations;
- 4) And that the cost of materials and installation for the regulatory signs be funded from capital project # 11305 (Traffic Operational Improvements) in the amount of approximately \$500;
- 5) And that the Parking Control Department be directed to enforce the parking prohibition upon approval of the By-law amendment and installation of the regulatory signs;
- 6) And that staff be authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to this resolution.

#### **PURPOSE:**

This report recommends prohibiting parking on the east side of Mary Elizabeth Crescent, from Morrison Crescent and property line #20/22. The intent of these recommendations is to resolve traffic safety issues associated with on-street parking.

### **BACKGROUND:**

Mary Elizabeth Crescent is a local residential street located near the intersection of Apple Creek Boulevard and Rodick Road. Staff was contacted regarding on-street parking activity occurring on Mary Elizabeth Crescent during Friday evenings on a regular basis. Parking activity is believed to be caused by Unionville Jamatkhana, located nearby. Residents are concerned that the parking activity is compromising traffic safety on Mary Elizabeth Crescent. A parking prohibition was implemented on Morrison Crescent several years ago to address the same issue.

### **DISCUSSION:**

Mary Elizabeth Crescent cannot accommodate both on-street parking and maintain two-way traffic.

Staff conducted a site assessment regarding the on-street parking concerns on Mary Elizabeth Crescent. With a road width of 8.5 metres, Mary Elizabeth Crescent is not able to facilitate two-way traffic flow when on-street parking activity is occurring on both sides of the street. Also, the

standard six-metre clearance requirement to allow passage for large fire services vehicles would not be met. Staff has notified all affected residents of Mary Elizabeth Crescent of the proposed parking prohibition.

# FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The cost of materials and installation for the signs is not expected to exceed \$500 and has been included in the capital project # 11305 (Traffic Operational Improvements). On-going maintenance costs for this installation is included in the 2013 Operations Department operating budget.

## **ALIGNMENT WITH STRATEGIC PRIORITIES:**

This report aligns with the community safety component of the transportation/transit strategic priority.


