

<u>Re</u> Report to General Committee : Status Update on Capital and Sustainable Neighborhood Retrofit Action Plan (SNAP) projects in the Don River Watershed

A representative of Bayview Glen Residents' Association will not be able to attend the General Committee Meeting on Monday, April 22nd however, we would appreciate if you could bring forward our concerns and comments regarding the report.

SNAP :

Bayview Glen is appreciative of the opportunity to have been chosen as a Sustainable Neighborhood Action Plan (SNAP) community and looks forward to a long term relationship with the TRCA particularly in terms of implementation of the Don Watershed Plan Study recommendations..

Don Watershed Plan and Implementation Guide : Options, Discussion :

In regards to the six key priority action areas within the Don River Watershed, we would appreciate consideration of expansion of items #1, #3 and #4. Please see red italicized text.

1. Incorporate sustainable community design principles and other watershed management directions into the Langstaff Gateway Secondary Plan initiative. <u>Recognize need for</u> <u>holistic approach in terms of implementation of the overall Don Watershed Study Plan</u> <u>recommendations in terms of current urban area infill development and all future areas</u> <u>of intensification within the Watershed (e.g. Langstaff Gateway, Yonge Steeles Corridor, Thornhill Revitalization project).</u>

3. Undertake a coordinated, collaborative approach to sustainable community retrofits in existing urban areas and to address watershed and municipal infrastructure retrofit priorities. <u>Utilize official plan</u>, secondary plan and specific zoning infill development bylaws to ensure implementation of an overall Watershed approach in terms of maximizing and achieving retrofit and sustainable community design principles.

4. Remediate erosion in ravines and priority erosions sites such as Pomona Creek, German Mills Creek and the East Don River as identified in the Markham Erosion Restoration Studies.

We would also request that the Don Watershed Task Force (# 7, Council Resolution) not be repealed but instead the terms of reference be amended to 'long term' rather than implementation of a plan within a ten (10) year period.
