1. Call to Order	The Animal Care Committee convened at 5:50 p.m. with Councillor Valerie Burke presiding as Chair. Janet Andrews assumed the Chair following the election of the Chair.

3. Discussion on Consultant's Report	<p>Kathy Wiele, Consultant, presented a report "The Future of City of Markham Animal Services: Priorities for Action to 2016". The report provided an analysis of the current state of Markham's animal services and identified top priorities for immediate action, as well as a proposed position on pet licensing.</p> <p>Chris Alexander brought several items in the report to the Committee's attention for review, and Ms. Wiele will update the report according to the Committee's directions. Chris will be meeting with Senior Management to present the report, and it will then be presented at a Special General Committee meeting on February 14, 2013.</p> <p>The Committee expressed appreciation to Kathy Wiele for her work on this report.</p>	<p>Update the report as directed by the Committee</p> <p style="text-align: center;">- Kathy Wiele</p>

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	<p>Trinela Cane, Commissioner of Corporate Services, attended later in the meeting and discussed the consultant’s report with respect to moving forward to set the strategy for the future of animal care in Markham.</p> <p>Moved by Denielle Duncan Seconded by Terri Daniels</p> <p>That the Markham Animal Care Committee endorses the report “The Future of City of Markham Animal Services: Priorities for Action to 2016” as revised.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">CARRIED</p>	
<p>4. Business Arising From the Minutes</p>	<p>A. <u>Review of Action Items</u></p> <p>The Committee reviewed the action items from the previous meeting. The following updates were provided:</p> <p>Terri Daniels provided an update on her consultation with the municipalities of Uxbridge, Windsor-Essex, and Guelph regarding fundraising calendars and processes. Terri indicated the municipalities are finding it to be a lot of work for the amount of return; however, Guelph is working on a new photo submission program and a further update will be provided. The Committee discussed alternate successful fund-raising events such as “Cheer for a year” involving a raffle of LCBO cards or other items. It was noted the calendar is a messaging vehicle, as well as a fundraising opportunity.</p> <p>Chris Alexander advised that he has been discussing a new electronic platform with IT staff for calendar submissions and will provide an update to the Committee.</p> <p>The Committee may do an e-mail vote for a decision on this matter, due to time constraints.</p>	<p>E-mail follow-up documents and information</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Terri Daniels <p>Update on new submission program</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Chris Alexander <p>Coordinate electronic vote, if required</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Laura Gold

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	<p>B. Harvesting of Animals</p> <p>The Committee reviewed correspondence between Mayor Frank Scarpitti and the Minister of Agriculture and Food in this regard, and considered the wording could be more specific. It was suggested that the demonstration video be shown at a regular General Committee meeting (not the Special GC meeting on February 14) to provide an impact to Council members. The presentation would occur following the outcome of the appeal by the City of Toronto, and could be presented in an environmental sustainability context with reference to the Greenprint sustainability plan.</p>	
<p>5. Animal Control Program Update</p>	<p>A. <u>Trap Neuter and Return (TNR) Pilot Project Update</u></p> <p>Chris Alexander advised that during early discussions with the OSPCA, it has been agreed that there will be two neuters/spays per week and that the City will pay for any necessary post-surgery recovery care.</p> <p>B. <u>Adoption Update</u></p> <p>The OSPCA has agreed to hold six adoption days per year, to be held off-site within Markham. The Committee suggested fall and spring dates and that an event be held at the Stiver Mill. It was also suggested that fees be reduced when there is a surplus of animals, and that adoption days be coordinated with other agencies reduced-fee days.</p> <p>C. <u>OSPCA Update</u></p> <p>Chris provided an update on the contract progress, advising the consultant's report will have a positive impact.</p> <p>The 2012 OSPCA Stats for Markham were reviewed: Intake: 213; Outcomes: 202 There were some discrepancies that were brought to the OSPCA's attention. Chris will be working with shelter officials to ensure figures are accurate in the future.</p>

Chris Alexander will provide an update at the next meeting.</p> <p>D. <u>Be Kind to Animals Week</u></p> <p>If the committee does not proceed with the calendar, another project needs to be planned. This will be added to the next agenda.</p> <p>E. <u>Licensing Wildlife Companies</u></p> <p>Chris Alexander is preparing a business plan.
