1. Call to Order	The Advisory Committee on Accessibility convened at 3:39 p.m. with Sidney Polak presiding as Chair.	
2. Site Plan Process	Staff reported that Planning & Design staff will come more frequently to the Advisory Committee on Accessibility (ACA) meetings. This will give the Committee an opportunity to provide feedback on site plans and it will give staff a better understanding of the type of things they should look for when reviewing site plans. Planning & Design Staff will also try to improve the site plan review process independently of this Committee.	Have Biju attend the December or January ACA meeting to discuss the site plan review process. Moreover, staff were open to inviting other senior Planning & Design staff to a future ACA meeting.
3. Accessible Taxi Cab update	<u>Accessible Taxi Cabs</u> Christopher Alexander, Supervisor of Licensing & Animal Control, was in attendance to provide an accessible taxicab update. It was advised that two open houses for taxicab stakeholder were held in July and August, 2012. The following feedback was obtained from these sessions: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The market for accessible taxicabs has been taken over by Mobility Plus;• The taxicab industry does not think it is financially viable to have accessible taxicabs in Markham at this time;	

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• There is currently no grant program to subsidize the cost of having an accessible taxicab in Markham;• The taxicab industry is currently not willing to provide accessible taxicab service in Markham. <p>Based on this update the Committee discussed the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The lack of awareness of Mobility Plus programs currently being offered;• The lack of awareness of the taxi script program;• The need for accessible taxicabs due to limited ability to book Mobility Plus rides at the last minute;• The possibility of having multipurpose taxicabs;• The latent demand for accessible taxicabs in Markham;• The need to change the behaviour of both able bodies and of persons with a disability in regards to the use of accessible taxicabs. 	<p><u>Serving Persons with Disability with a Service Dog</u></p>	Investigate what the penalty is for being in contravention with <i>AODA</i> –Christopher Alexander

Christopher Alexander reported that a resident and his partner were denied service to a restaurant due to the fact that the resident had two service dogs. There was no complaint filed with the province, as the resident did not choose to pursue this option. However, staff were investigating whether there is a penalty for being in contravention with *AODA*.

There was a discussion in regards to adding a clause to Markham's Stationary Business Licensing By-law regarding prohibiting businesses from refusing access to goods and services to persons with a disability with a service dog or a person accompanying them.

STOP-GAP RAMPS</p>	<p>Luke Anderson from Stop-Gap Ramps was in attendance to speak to the Committee regarding its ramps.</p> <p>To date these ramps have been provided to stores and restaurants in participating neighbourhoods free of charge. This was achieved through local community initiatives where both the labour and materials to build the ramps were donated. The ramps are to be used at the business's own risk and are typically placed at the store front only when required. These ramps have been claimed to have transformed the accessibility of certain neighbourhoods in the Greater Toronto Area.</p>	<p>Look into initiating a community project to provide Stop-Gap Ramps to businesses on Main Street Unionville or on Main Street Markham free of Charge – Warren Rupnarain & Graham Seaman</p>

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	<p>possibly be done in partnership with a local high school with a wood shop or with the Mayor's Youth Task Force.</p> <p>Warren Rupnarain and Graham Seaman will investigate the possibility of initiating this project in Markham. In order to proceed with this type of a project, staff will need to investigate possible liability issues with the City of Markham being associated with providing the ramps free of charge. It was noted that all business that receive a free ramp are required to sign a waiver, which removes any risk from Stop Gap-Ramps and any other participating organization .</p>	<p>Look into any possible risk associated with the City of Markham initiating a project to provide Stop-Gap-Ramps free charge to local businesses - Warren Rupnarain & Graham Seaman</p>
