SUBJECT: Sweden's Smart Communities Tour

September 8-15, 2012 in Stockholm Sweden

PREPARED BY: Peter Loukes, Environmental Services

RECOMMENDATION:

1. That authorization be granted for two staff (one from Environmental Services Department of Community and Fire Services Commission and one staff from Development Services Commission) to attend the Smart Energy Communities Tour in Stockholm, Sweden in September 2012;

- 2. And that expenses be paid in accordance to Town's Policy from the 2012 Operating Budget;
- 3. And further that Staff be authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to this resolution.

PURPOSE:

The purpose of this report is to obtain approval for Peter Loukes, Director, Environmental Services, one representative from Development Services, and Regional Councillor Joe Li to attend the Smart Communities Tour in Stockholm Sweden in September 2012.

BACKGROUND:

At a recent meeting in Markham organized by Regional Councillor Joe Li staff and developer representatives met with the Trade Commissioner and Honorary Consul for Sweden to see the urban sustainability concepts being used in Sweden. Of particular interest was the ENVAC vacuum system for waste management; however they also touched on several other areas such as architecture, energy, landscape, and water recycling. As Markham prepares to build its city centre and intensify the development and strategic redevelopment of some areas of the community, the concepts of sustainable development are a priority.

Subsequent to that meeting the Embassy of Sweden contacted Regional Councillor Li inviting the Councillor and staff to attend the Smart Communities Tour in Sweden in September. The Smart Communities Tour has been organized by the Swedish Trade Council, in cooperation with the QUEST (Quality Urban Energy Systems of Tomorrow) and the Canadian Urban Institute. The tour will give delegates an opportunity to see how various communities in Sweden are accelerating their sustainability strategies by integrating the energy activities in buildings, the supply and treatment of water, transportation and goods movement, and the management of waste and energy infrastructure.

The tour will start in Stockholm and travel through to Denmark. Highlights of the tour include:

Hammarby Sjostad – A redeveloped brown field industrial area of Stockholm that is now home to over 10,000 apartment units built with comprehensive environmental targets.

Stockholm Royal Seaport – Another brown field site in Stockholm that is one of the largest city planning projects in Europe with an ambitious goal to be fossil fuel free.

Tekniska Verken - Swedish Utility company that operates in the electricity, water, district heating/cooling, waste management, broadband, and biogas sectors

Southern Scania Waste Management Company (SYSAV) – Owned by the City of Malmo and 13 neighbouring municipalities (665,000 residents), SYSAV landfills only 5% of their waste. 95% of waste is either recycled or goes to their Energy from Waste facility

There will also be several opportunities to meet with industry and government representatives.

The itinerary of this tour will give staff a great opportunity to see urban sustainable concepts in use and will be helpful in the planning and operations of such techniques in Markham's community development projects.

It is recommended that one staff member from both the Development Service Commission and the Community and Fire Services Commission should attend.

I understand from our representatives in Toronto, Mr. Kristofer Fröjd, Trade Commissioner, and Mr. Lars Henriksson, Honorary Consul, that you have expressed interest in bringing a group of representatives from the Town of Markham, Region of York and developers in Markham and York Region to Sweden to study urban sustainability in our country. I would be happy to meet with you in connection with my next trip to Toronto on 8-9 July to learn more about Markham and York Region and to discuss your interest in urban sustainable solutions. Please coordinate with Consul Lars Henriksson if this would be of interest to you.

The Swedish Trade Council, in cooperation with the Embassy of Sweden, QUEST – Quality Urban Energy Systems of Tomorrow and the Swedish Energy Agency, has the pleasure of inviting you to participte in an educational tour to Sweden. Get inspired and come back informed about Smart Energy Communities and how their businesses, utilities and citizens are committed to sustainable building and transportation development.

Sweden is an internationally recognized leader in integrated energy solutions through sustainable development.

This tour will take participants during the week of September 8-15, 2012 to communities across Sweden that are accelerating their sustainability strategies by integrating the energy activities associated with buildings, the supply and treatment of water, transportation and goods movement, the management of waste and energy infrastructure.

- Integration of fuels, technologies and services for meeting heating, cooling, and power needs through site visits to plants.

The tour will also explore how smaller and rural communities in Sweden are successfully developing local economic markets around alternative and renewable energy systems.
