1. DIVERSITY INITIATIVES' UPDATE

Cheryl McConney-Wilson, Diversity Specialist delivered a PowerPoint presentation regarding the diversity action plan.

The Committee discussed the following:

- Statistics on the language line at the Contact Centre
- Statistics regarding the Google translate on the portal site

- Inclusion of lesbian, gay, bisexual and trans (LGBT) community
- Language and culture should be included with the diversity plan
- Ensuring diversity is achieved when hiring Town of Markham summer students
- Lottery strategy relative to summer recruitment
- Ensuring the Race Relation Committee is involved in the diversity process
- Should income be included as part of the diversity plan?
- Importance of enhancing the opportunity for public engagement regarding diversity

2. MUNICIPAL SERVICES

Paul Ingham, Director, Operations delivered a PowerPoint presentation regarding Municipal Services.

The Committee advised that they receive remarkable feedback on the Town's level of service and thanked Mr. Ingham along with all his staff for their excellent service.

There was discussion regarding any potential areas of concern. Staff indicated that the on-going block pruning program could be difficult to sustain. Staff pointed out the impact on staff resources with respect to the growing number of special events.
