5. BUSINESS PLAN	The Committee reviewed the draft 2012 Business Plan, noting it was important to set realistic goals for 2012. It was agreed that the Committee would review the plan in greater detail before the next meeting. An update on the plan will be provided at the next meeting. <p>7. ANIMAL CONTROL UPDATE</p>	<p>Mr. Bill Wiles, Manager of By-Laws & Enforcement, reviewed the report entitled “Extension of Animal Services Contract-January 2012 to June 2013”. It was noted that the report will be brought forward to the General Committee in late November or in early December. The report is currently being reviewed by senior staff and will be available on the Town’s website the Friday afternoon prior to the General Committee meeting the report is being reviewed at.</p> <p>The report recommends that the OSPCA contract be extended until June 2013. The Committee questioned if wildlife services would be included in the contract. It was confirmed that wildlife services is included in the contract. A Member questioned if the OSPCA is licensed to deal with wildlife. It was explained that the OSPCA can legally deal with wildlife, as long as the animal is moved within 24 hours. Staff advised that the cost of the Town’s contract with the OSPCA is fixed and would not change if wildlife was excluded from the contract. The Committee questioned if the OSPCA is willing to bring wildlife to Toronto Wildlife.</p> <p>Staff advised that to date Toronto Wildlife has been unwilling to accept Markham animals. Currently, the Town pays various wildlife rehabilitation groups on an as need basis and the Toronto Wildlife does not wish to operate that way.</p> <p>It was suggested that the Town consider adding a clause to its contract with the OPSCA regarding accountability and transparency.</p> <p>Staff advised that a consultant is being hired to look at best practices for animal control in Markham. There was an inquiry on the status of the request for proposal to hire a consultant to conduct a feasibility study on the best animal control option for Markham. It was reported that the study options are being reviewed as the quotes to conduct the study came in much higher than expected. 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	<p>of the study and do some of the work in-house.</p> <p>The Committee made a correction to the report, noting euthanasia rates are high due to a number of factors, rather than due to the number of feral cats brought to the shelter. It was recommended that all of these factors be included in the report.</p> <p>The Committee questioned if the OSPCA is working with rescue groups. It was confirmed that the OSPCA is now working with or has plans to work with rescue groups. The Committee felt that the public need to be educated on this matter.</p> <p>It was questioned if the OSPCA was willing to work with the Town to improve adoption promotion and rates. It was confirmed that the OSPCA will work with the Town to improve adoption promotion and rates. It was reported that the OSPCA is willing to hold adoption days at Town facilities, noting Markville mall was not interested in holding adoption days at the mall. It was recommended that the Committee put in its business plan the target number of adoption days to be held in 2012. The adoption days could be open to rescue groups.</p> <p>Staff advised that the OSPCA is generally very good at handling complaints. However, it was recommended that inquires to the OSPCA should be made through Markham's Contact Centre so that the request can be tracked. Residents can leave a message, send an email or call the emergency hotline after hours. The Committee noted that this needs to be communicated to Markham residents.</p> <p>Mr. Wiles asked if any of the Members would like a hard copy of the OSPCA report. Janet Andrews advised that she would like a hard copy of the OSPCA report.</p> <p>It was reported that staff will continue to study the Calgary model for delivering animal services. This would provide a better indication of the OSPCA's operations.</p> <p>It was questioned if Town Officers can receive similar training to the OSPCA Officers.
